- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is 6
- 7 amended by adding Section 33.096 to read as follows:
- Sec. 33.096. CARDIAC ASSESSMENTS OF HIGH 8 SCHOOL
- 9 PARTICIPANTS IN EXTRACURRICULAR ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES. (a) A school
- 10 district must provide a district student, who is required under
- University Interscholastic League rule or policy to receive a 11
- physical examination before being allowed to participate in an 12
- athletic activity sponsored or sanctioned by the University 13
- Interscholastic League, the following: 14
- (1) information about sudden cardiac arrest 15
- electrocardiogram testing; and 16
- (2) notification of the option of the student to 17
- request the administration of an electrocardiogram, in addition to 18
- 19 the physical examination.
- (b) A student may request an electrocardiogram from any 20
- 21 appropriately licensed health care professional whose scope of
- practice includes the administration and 22 review of
- electrocardiograms, including the student's patient-centered 23
- 24 medical home, as defined by Section 533.0029, Government Code, a

- 1 health care professional provided through a school district
- 2 program, or another health care professional chosen by the parent
- 3 or person standing in parental relation to the student.
- 4 <u>(c) The University Interscholastic League shall adopt rules</u> 5 as necessary to administer this section.
- 6 (d) The rules adopted under Subsection (c) must include:
- 7 (1) criteria under which a school district may request
- 8 an exemption from the requirements of Subsection (a);
- 9 (2) variances that allow for a delay of the
- 10 implementation of the requirement to notify students of the option
- 11 to receive an electrocardiogram under this section;
- 12 (3) procedures to ensure students receiving the
- 13 required annual physical examination are notified of the option to
- 14 receive an electrocardiogram; and
- 15 (4) provisions to ensure that the requirements under
- 16 this section are minimum standards that provide a school district
- 17 with the option to implement a program that exceeds the standards

- 19 (e) This section does not create a cause of action or
- 20 liability or a standard of care, obligation, or duty that provides a

- 1 with the administration or evaluation of or reliance on an
- 2 <u>electrocardiogram; or</u>
- 3 (2) the content or distribution of the information
- 4 required under Subsection (a) or the failure to distribute the
- 5 required information under this section.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
