A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT relating to voter registration procedures. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Sections 13.002(a) and (b), Election Code, are amended to read as follows: (a) A person desiring to register to vote must submit an application to the registrar of the county in which the person resides. Except as provided by Subsection (e), an application must be submitted by personal delivery, by mail, electronically through the official Internet website of this state in accordance with Section 13.009, or by telephonic facsimile machine in accordance with Sections 13.143(d) and (d-2). (b) Except as provided by Section 13.009, a [A] registration application must be in writing and signed by the applicant. SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 13, Election Code, is amended by adding Sections 13.009 and 13.010 to read as follows: Sec. 13.009. ELECTRONIC VOTER REGISTRATION. (a) In this section, "digital signature" means an electronic identifier intended by the person using it to have the same force and effect as the use of a manual signature. (b) An electronically transmitted application for voter registration issued or received by a registrar is considered signed if a digital signature is transmitted with the document. (c) The secretary of state shall implement a program to

The secretary shall prescribe procedures necessary to 19 implement this subsection. 20 21 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
