1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the disclosure under the public information law of
 1-20 certain information related to parades, concerts, or other
 1-21 entertainment events open to the general public that are paid for
 1-22 with public funds.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 552.104, Government Code, is amended by
 1-25 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
 1-26 follows:

1-27 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the [The]
 1-28 requirement of Section 552.022 that a category of information
 1-29 listed under Section 552.022(a) is public information and not
 1-30 excepted from required disclosure under this chapter unless
 1-31 expressly confidential under law does not apply to information that
 1-32 is excepted from required disclosure under this section.

1-33 (c) Subsection (b) does not apply to information described
 1-34 by Section 552.022(a) relating to the receipt or expenditure of
 1-35 public or other funds by a governmental body for a parade, concert,
 1-36 or other entertainment event paid for in whole or part with public
 1-37 funds. A person, including a governmental body, may not include a
 1-38 provision in a contract related to an event described by this
 1-39 subsection that prohibits or would otherwise prevent the disclosure
 1-40 of information described by this subsection. A contract provision
 1-41 that violates this subsection is void.

1-42 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
 1-43 to:

1-44 (1) a request for information that is received by a
 1-45 governmental body or an officer for public information on or after
 1-46 the effective date of this Act; and

1-47 (2) a contract entered into or renewed on or after the
 1-48 effective date of this Act.

1-49 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-50 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-51 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-52 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-53 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
