A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to measures to assist students enrolled at public
- 3 institutions of higher education who are homeless or who were
- 4 formerly in foster care.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 51.9356, Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 51.9356. DESIGNATION OF LIAISON OFFICER TO ASSIST
- 9 STUDENTS WHO WERE FORMERLY IN FOSTER CARE OR WHO ARE HOMELESS. (a)
- 10 In this section:
- 11 (1) "Institution[, "institution] of higher education"
- 12 has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
- 13 (2) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 14 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 15 Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student
- 16 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
- 17 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
- 18 <u>terms.</u>
- 19 (b) Each institution of higher education shall designate at
- 20 least one employee of the institution to act as a liaison officer
- 21 for current and incoming:
- 22 (1) students [at the institution] who were formerly in
- 23 the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective
- 24 Services; and

- 1 (2) students who are homeless.
- 2 <u>(c)</u> The liaison officer shall:
- 3 (1) contact a person designated under 42 U.S.C.
- 4 Section 11432(g)(1)(J)(ii) as necessary to facilitate the
- 5 transition of students described by Subsection (b) from secondary
- 6 to postsecondary education; and
- 7 (2) provide to those students information regarding
- 8 support services and other resources available to the students at
- 9 the institution of higher education, including information about
- 10 financial aid, on-campus and off-campus housing, food and meal
- 11 programs, counseling services, and any other relevant information
- 12 to assist the students.
- 13 (d) The board shall adopt rules and establish policies and
- 14 procedures to ensure that a liaison officer designated under this
- 15 <u>section to serve students who are homeless participates in a</u>
- 16 professional development program under 42 U.S.C. Section
- 17 11432(d)(5).
- 18 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 51.978, Education Code,
- 19 is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 51.978. TEMPORARY HOUSING BETWEEN ACADEMIC TERMS FOR
- 21 CERTAIN STUDENTS WHO WERE FORMERLY UNDER CONSERVATORSHIP OF
- 22 DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES OR WHO ARE HOMELESS.
- SECTION 3. Section 51.978(a), Education Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Subdivision (3) to read as follows:
- 25 (3) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 26 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 27 Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student

- 1 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
- 2 <u>during an academic term but who are homeless between</u> academic
- 3 terms.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 51.978(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) To be eligible to receive housing assistance from an
- 7 institution of higher education under Subsection (c), a student
- 8 must:
- 9 (1) be:
- 10 <u>(A) a student who has</u> [have] been under the
- 11 conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services
- 12 or its predecessor in function on the day preceding:
- (i) $\left[\frac{\langle A \rangle}{\langle A \rangle}\right]$ the student's 18th birthday; or
- 14 (ii) [(B)] the date the student's
- 15 disabilities of minority are removed by a court under Chapter 31,
- 16 Family Code; or
- 17 (B) a student who is homeless;
- 18 (2) be enrolled full-time at the institution during
- 19 the academic term:
- 20 (A) for which the student requests the housing
- 21 <u>assistance; or</u>
- 22 <u>(B)</u> immediately preceding the period for which
- 23 the student requests the housing assistance;
- 24 (3) be registered or otherwise have taken the actions
- 25 required by the institution to permit the student to enroll
- 26 full-time at the institution during the academic term immediately
- 27 following the period for which the student requests the housing

- 1 assistance; and
- 2 (4) lack other reasonable temporary housing
- 3 alternatives between the academic terms described by Subdivisions
- 4 (2) and (3), as determined by the institution.
- 5 SECTION 5. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 51.9781 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 51.9781. PRIORITY ACCESS TO STUDENT HOUSING FOR
- 8 STUDENTS WHO ARE HOMELESS. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
- 10 assigned by Section 61.003.
- 11 (2) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 12 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 13 <u>Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student</u>
- 14 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education
- 15 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
- 16 terms.
- 17 (b) An institution of higher education that maintains
- 18 student housing facilities shall give priority in the assignment of
- 19 housing in those facilities to students who are homeless.
- SECTION 6. Section 61.0908, Education Code, is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- Sec. 61.0908. DESIGNATION OF LIAISON OFFICER TO ASSIST
- 23 STUDENTS WHO WERE FORMERLY IN FOSTER CARE OR WHO ARE HOMELESS. (a)
- 24 In this section, "students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 25 <u>assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.</u>

- 3 (b) The board shall designate at least one employee of the
- 4 board to act as a liaison officer for the following current and
- 5 incoming students at institutions of higher education:
- 6 (1) students who were formerly in the conservatorship
- 7 of the Department of Family and Protective Services; and
- 8 (2) students who are homeless.
- 9 (c) The liaison officer shall assist in coordinating
- 10 college readiness and student success efforts relating to [those]
- 11 students described by Subsection (b).
- 12 (d) The board shall establish policies and procedures to
- 13 ensure that a liaison officer designated under this section to
- 14 serve students who are homeless participates in a professional
- development program under 42 U.S.C. Section 11432(d)(5).
- SECTION 7. Section 61.0909, Education Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 61.0909. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING
- 19 EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS FORMERLY IN FOSTER CARE OR WHO
- 20 ARE HOMELESS. (a) In this section:
- 21 (1) "Agency" means the Texas Education Agency.
- 22 (2) "Department" [The image of the image
- 23 Department of Family and Protective Services.
- 24 (3) "Students who are homeless" has the meaning
- 25 assigned to the term "homeless children and youths" under 42 U.S.C.
- 26 Section 11434a and includes students who reside in a student
- 27 housing facility maintained by an institution of higher education

- 1 during an academic term but who are homeless between academic
- 2 terms.
- 3 (b) The board, the agency, and the department shall enter
- 4 into a memorandum of understanding regarding the exchange of
- 5 information as appropriate to facilitate:
- 6 $\underline{(1)}$ the department's evaluation of educational
- 7 outcomes of students at institutions of higher education who were
- 8 formerly in the conservatorship of the department; and
- 9 (2) the agency's evaluation of educational outcomes at
- 10 institutions of higher education of students who are homeless.
- 11 (b-1) The memorandum of understanding must require:
- 12 (1) the department to provide the board each year with
- 13 demographic information regarding individual students enrolled at
- 14 institutions of higher education who were formerly in the
- 15 conservatorship of the department following an adversarial hearing
- 16 under Section 262.201, Family Code;
- 17 (2) the agency to provide the board each year with
- 18 demographic information regarding individual students who are
- 19 homeless and who are enrolled at an institution of higher
- 20 education; and
- 21 $\underline{(3)}$ [$\underline{(2)}$] the board, in a manner consistent with
- 22 federal law, to provide:
- 23 <u>(A)</u> the department with aggregate
- 24 information regarding educational outcomes of students for whom
- 25 the board received demographic information under Subdivision (1);
- 26 and
- (B) the agency with aggregate information

- 1 regarding educational outcomes of students for whom the board
- 2 received demographic information under Subdivision (2).
- 3 (c) For purposes of Subsection $(b-1)(3) \left[\frac{(b)(2)}{2}\right]$,
- 4 information regarding educational outcomes includes information
- 5 relating to student academic achievement, graduation rates,
- 6 attendance, and other educational outcomes as determined by the
- 7 board, the agency, and the department.
- 8 (d) The department or the agency may authorize the board to
- 9 provide education research centers established under Section 1.005
- 10 with demographic information regarding individual students
- 11 received by the board in accordance with Subsection (b-1)(3)
- 12 $\left[\frac{b}{1}\right]$, as appropriate to allow the centers to perform additional
- 13 analysis regarding educational outcomes of students who were
- 14 formerly in the conservatorship of the department and of students
- 15 who are homeless [foster care]. Any use of information regarding
- 16 individual students provided to a center under this subsection must
- 17 be approved by the department or the agency, as applicable.
- 18 (e) This [Nothing in this] section may not be construed to:
- 19 (1) require the board, the agency, or the department
- 20 to collect or maintain additional information regarding students
- 21 formerly in the conservatorship of the department or students who
- 22 <u>are homeless;</u> or
- 23 (2) allow the release of information regarding an
- 24 individual student in a manner not permitted under the Family
- 25 Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section
- 26 1232g) or another state or federal law.
- 27 SECTION 8. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective

- 1 date of this Act, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 2 shall adopt rules and establish policies and procedures as required
- 3 by Section 51.9356, Education Code, as amended by this Act.
- 4 (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 5 Act, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall establish
- 6 policies and procedures as required by Section 61.0908, Education
- 7 Code, as amended by this Act.
- 8 (c) Not later than January 1, 2020, the Texas Higher
- 9 Education Coordinating Board shall designate a liaison officer as
- 10 required by Section 61.0908, Education Code, as amended by this
- 11 Act.
- 12 (d) Not later than March 1, 2020, the Texas Higher Education
- 13 Coordinating Board, the Department of Family and Protective
- 14 Services, and the Texas Education Agency shall enter into the
- 15 memorandum of understanding as required by Section 61.0909,
- 16 Education Code, as amended by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
