11	(2) one chiropractor;
12	(3) one representative of a boxing promoter;

15	(5) one combative sports referee or judge, licensed at
16	<pre>least three years; and</pre>
17	(6) one former combative sports contestant.
18	(c) If the commission appoints an advisory board, the
19	<pre>commission by rule shall establish:</pre>
20	(1) [the number of board members;
21	$[\frac{(2)}{2}]$ qualifications for appointment to the board; and
22	(2) [(3)] the purpose and duties of the board.
23	SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
24	2052.055, Occupations Code, regarding the composition of the

- 1 combative sports advisory board do not affect the entitlement of a
- 2 member serving on the advisory board immediately before the
- 3 effective date of this Act to continue to serve and function as a
- 4 member of the advisory board for the remainder of the member's term
- 5 as established by the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation.
- 6 As the terms of members expire or as vacancies occur on the advisory
- 7 board on or after the effective date of this Act, the presiding
- 8 officer of the commission, with the approval of the other
- 9 commission members, shall appoint members to the advisory board in
- 10 a manner consistent with the changes in law made by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
