A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to exemption of certain firefighters and police officers 3 from jury service. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 62.106(a), Government Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: 6 7 (a) A person qualified to serve as a petit juror may establish an exemption from jury service if the person: 8 9 is over 70 years of age; has legal custody of a child younger than 12 years 10 (2) of age and the person's service on the jury requires leaving the 11 12 child without adequate supervision; 13 is a student of a public or private secondary (3) 14 school; (4) is a person enrolled and in actual attendance at an 15 institution of higher education; 16 is an officer or an employee of the senate, the 17 (5) house of representatives, or any department, commission, board, 18 office, or other agency in the legislative branch of state 19 20 government; 21 (6) is summoned for service in a county with a population of at least 200,000, unless that county uses a jury plan 22 23 under Section 62.011 and the period authorized under Section 62.011(b)(5) exceeds two years, and the person has served as a petit 24

1 juror in the county during the 24-month period preceding the date
2 the person is to appear for jury service;

3 (7) is the primary caretaker of a person who is unable4 to care for himself or herself;

5 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b), is summoned 6 for service in a county with a population of at least 250,000 and 7 the person has served as a petit juror in the county during the 8 three-year period preceding the date the person is to appear for 9 jury service; [<del>or</del>]

10 (9) is a member of the United States military forces 11 serving on active duty and deployed to a location away from the 12 person's home station and out of the person's county of residence;

13 (10) is a firefighter, including a fire chief, who is 14 a permanent, paid employee of the fire department of a municipality 15 or county or of a special district or authority that provides 16 firefighting services; or

17 <u>(11) is a police officer, including a police chief,</u> 18 who is a permanent, paid employee of the police department of a 19 <u>municipality or county</u>.

20 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 21 the establishment of an exemption from jury service for a person 22 summoned to appear for jury service on a date on or after the 23 effective date of this Act.
