A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to certain duties of public institutions of higher education and the Department of State Health Services regarding 1-19 1-20 1-21 policies on the use of epinephrine auto-injectors by public 1-22 1-23 institutions of higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 51.882, Education Code, is amended by 1-25 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: 1-26

1-27 1-28 (d) Each institution of higher education that adopts a policy under Subsection (a):

(1) must require that the institution's campuses have 1-29 1-30 personnel or volunteers authorized and trained to administer an 1-31 epinephrine auto-injector present; and

(2) shall include the policy in the institution's student handbook or similar publication and publish the policy on 1-32 1-33 the institution's Internet website. 1-34

1-37	Services a copy of the policy and any amendment to the policy
