A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to warning labels for opioid prescription drugs.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 481.074(a), Health and Safety Code, is 4 5
- amended to read as follows:
- (a) A pharmacist may not: 6
- 7 dispense or deliver a controlled substance or
- cause a controlled substance to be dispensed or delivered under the 8
- 9 pharmacist's direction or supervision except under
- 10 prescription and in the course of professional practice;
- 11 dispense a controlled substance if the pharmacist
- 12 knows or should have known that the prescription was issued without
- a valid patient-practitioner relationship; 13
- 14 (3) fill a prescription that is not prepared or issued
- as prescribed by this chapter; 15
- (4) permit or allow a person who is not a licensed 16
- pharmacist or pharmacist intern to dispense, distribute, or in any 17
- other manner deliver a controlled substance even if under the 18
- supervision of a pharmacist, except that after the pharmacist or 19
- 20 pharmacist intern has fulfilled his professional and legal
- responsibilities, a nonpharmacist may complete the actual cash or 21
- credit transaction and delivery; [or] 22
- 23 (5) permit the delivery of a controlled substance to
- 24 any person not known to the pharmacist, the pharmacist intern, or

- 1 the person authorized by the pharmacist to deliver the controlled
- 2 substance without first requiring identification of the person
- 3 taking possession of the controlled substance, except as provided
- 4 by Subsection (n); or
- 5 (6) dispense or deliver an opioid without a warning
- 6 label required by board rule under Section 481.0761(1).
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 481.0761, Health and Safety Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 9 (1) The board shall adopt rules requiring that a
- 10 prescription for an opioid be dispensed in a bottle with a warning
- 11 label that addresses the risk of addiction and overdose. The label
- 12 must include language substantially similar to the following, in
- 13 all capital letters and printed in 14-point font:
- 14 "WARNING: THIS DRUG IS AN OPIOID. THE USE OF AN OPIOID MAY
- 15 RESULT IN ADDICTION TO OPIOIDS AND DEATH.".
- SECTION 3. The Texas State Board of Pharmacy shall adopt the
- 17 rules required under Section 481.0761(1), Health and Safety Code,
- 18 as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2020.
- 19 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 20 to a prescription for an opioid dispensed on or after March 1, 2020.
- 21 A prescription dispensed before March 1, 2020, is governed by the
- 22 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 23 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
