1	AN ACT
2	relating to an exemption for a homeless individual from the payment
3	of a fee for the issuance of a driver's license or personal
4	identification certificate.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter R, Chapter 521, Transportation Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 521.4265 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 521.4265. EXEMPTION FOR HOMELESS INDIVIDUAL. (a) In
9	this section, "homeless individual":
10	(1) means an individual who:
11	(A) lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate
12	nighttime residence; or
13	(B) has a primary nighttime residence that is:
14	(i) a supervised publicly or privately
15	operated shelter designed to provide temporary living
16	accommodations, including welfare hotels, congregate shelters, and
17	transitional housing for the mentally ill;
18	(ii) an institution that provides a
19	temporary residence for individuals intended to be
20	institutionalized; or
21	(iii) a public or private place not
22	designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping
23	accommodation for human beings; and
24	(2) does not include an individual who is imprisoned

- 1 or otherwise detained in a correctional facility.
- 2 (b) Except as provided by Subsections (f) and (i), a
- 3 homeless individual is entitled to an exemption from the payment of
- 4 fees under this chapter for the issuance of a driver's license or
- 5 personal identification certificate.
- 6 (c) For the purposes of this section, a person's status as a
- 7 <u>homeless individual must be confirmed by a notarized affidavit</u>
- 8 from:
- 9 (1) an employee of a homeless shelter or transitional
- 10 housing facility;
- 11 (2) an employee of an organization that provides to
- 12 homeless individuals or assists homeless individuals in obtaining
- 13 <u>services such as health services</u>, mental or behavioral health
- 14 services, substance abuse services, public assistance services, or
- 15 employment services;
- 16 (3) an attorney licensed to practice law in this
- 17 state;
- 18 <u>(4) a peace officer who is an official homeless</u>
- 19 liaison;
- 20 (5) an employee of a faith-based organization that
- 21 provides benefits or services to homeless individuals; or
- 22 (6) a counselor or administrator at a school attended
- 23 by the homeless individual.
- 24 (d) A person may not charge a fee for the affidavit
- 25 described by Subsection (c).
- 26 (e) An affidavit described by Subsection (c) may not be used
- 27 for a driver's license or personal identification certificate

- 1 application if the affidavit was signed more than 60 days before the
- 2 date the application is submitted.
- 3 (f) Subsection (b) does not apply to a person subject to the
- 4 registration requirements of Chapter 62, Code of Criminal
- 5 Procedure.
- 6 (g) For each exemption granted under this section the
- 7 department shall deposit to the credit of the Texas mobility fund an
- 8 amount from the identification fee exemption account under
- 9 Subsection (h) that is equal to the amount of the waived fee that
- 10 would otherwise be deposited to the mobility fund.
- 11 (h) The identification fee exemption account is created as
- 12 an account in the general revenue fund of the state treasury. The
- 13 fund consists of grants and donations made to the department for the
- 14 purposes of this section. The department shall administer the
- 15 account. Money in the account may be appropriated for the purposes
- 16 of Subsection (g).
- 17 <u>(i) The department may not grant an exemption under this</u>
- 18 section if money is not available in the identification fee
- 19 exemption account to meet the requirements of Subsection (g).
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
