(a) This section applies only to a municipality that contains more than 75 percent of the population of a county with a 10 population of 1.5 million or more. 11 12 (b) In purchasing as authorized under this title any personal property that is not affixed to real property or services other than professional services, if a municipality that solicits

 other than professional services, if a municipality that solicits
 requests for proposals receives one or more proposals from an
 offeror whose principal place of business is in the municipality,
 the municipality may consider, as a percentage of the evaluation
 factors in accordance with Subsection (c), an offeror's principal
 place of business unless the contract is for construction services
 in an amount of \$100,000 or more.
- 21 <u>(c) If a municipality elects to consider an offeror's</u>
 22 <u>principal place of business under Subsection (b) and scores an</u>
 23 <u>offeror's proposal on a 100-point scale, the municipality shall</u>
- 24 <u>assign:</u>

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1	(1) 10 points to an offeror with a principal place of
2	business in the municipality; or
3	(2) five points to an offeror who employs:
4	(A) at least 20 percent of the offeror's
5	employees in the municipality; or
6	(B) at least 100 employees in the municipality.
7	(d) This section does not prohibit a municipality from
8	rejecting any proposal.
9	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
10	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
11	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
12	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
13	Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
