A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to a continuing review and revision of the essential
- 3 knowledge and skills of the public school foundation curriculum and
- 4 proclamations for the production of instructional materials.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 28.0025 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 28.0025. REVIEW AND REVISION OF ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE
- 9 AND SKILLS. (a) The State Board of Education shall:
- 10 <u>(1) conduct a review of the essential knowledge and</u>
- 11 skills for the foundation curriculum adopted under Section
- 12 <u>28.002(a)(1); and</u>

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- 13 (2) as necessary, revise the essential knowledge and
- 14 skills for that curriculum to narrow the number and scope of student
- 15 expectations for each subject and grade level in accordance with
- 16 this section.
- 17 (b) The scope of the essential knowledge and skills for each
- 18 subject and grade level of the foundation curriculum must:
- 19 <u>(1) be more narrow than the scope of the essential</u>
- 20 knowledge and skills adopted as of January 1, 2019; and
- 21 (2) require less time for a demonstration of mastery
- 22 than required for the essential knowledge and skills adopted as of
- 23 January 1, 2019.
- 24 (c) In complying with this section, the State Board of

1 Education shall: 2 (1) consider for each subject and grade level, the 3 time: 4 (A) a teacher would require to provide 5 comprehensive instruction on a particular student expectation; and 6 (B) a typical student would require to master a 7 particular student expectation; 8 (2) determine whether, in light of the consideration required by Subdivision (1), each essential knowledge and skill of 9 10 a subject can be comprehensively taught within the instruction time provided by Section 25.081, not including the amount of time 11 12 required for testing; 13 (3) determine whether the college and career readiness 14 standards have been appropriately integrated in the essential 15 knowledge and skills for each subject and grade level; and 16 (4) consider whether an assessment instrument 17 administered under Section 39.023 adequately assesses a particular student expectation. 18 19 (c-1) The State Board of Education must ensure that any revision of the essential knowledge and skills for the foundation 20 curriculum performed before September 1, 2022, does not result in a 21 need for the adoption of new instructional materials. This section 22 expires September 1, 2023. 23 24 (d) The State Board of Education shall adopt a schedule for

continuing the review and revision required by this section of the

essential knowledge and skills for each subject and grade level of

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the foundation curriculum.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Section 31.002, Education Code, is amended by
- 2 adding Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows:
- 3 (1-b) "Proclamation" means a request for production of
- 4 instructional materials issued by the State Board of Education.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 31.022, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), and (b-3) and amending Subsection
- 7 (f) to read as follows:
- 8 (b-1) For any state fiscal biennium, the board may only
- 9 issue proclamations for instructional materials in which the total
- 10 projected cost of instructional materials under the proclamations
- 11 does not exceed 75 percent of the total amount used to fund the
- 12 instructional materials and technology allotment under Section
- 13 31.0211 for that biennium.
- 14 (b-2) Following the adoption of revised essential knowledge
- 15 and skills for any subject, the board shall determine whether
- 16 <u>issuance of a proclamation is necessary based on the significance</u>
- 17 of the changes to the essential knowledge and skills. If the board
- 18 determines a proclamation is necessary, the board shall issue:
- 19 (1) a full call for instructional materials aligned to
- 20 all of the essential knowledge and skills for the subject and grade
- 21 <u>level;</u>
- 22 (2) a supplemental call for instructional materials
- 23 aligned to new or expanded essential knowledge and skills for the
- 24 subject and grade level;
- 25 (3) a call for new information demonstrating alignment
- 26 of current instructional materials to the revised essential
- 27 knowledge and skills; or

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- 1 (4) any combination of the calls described by
- 2 Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).
- 3 (b-3) In determining the disbursement of money to the
- 4 available school fund and the amount of that disbursement that will
- 5 be used, in accordance with Section 43.001(d), to fund the
- 6 instructional materials and technology allotment under Section
- 7 31.0211, the board must consider the cost of all instructional
- 8 materials and technology requirements for that state fiscal
- 9 biennium.
- 10 (f) The board shall amend any <u>proclamation</u> [request for
- 11 production] issued for the purchase of instructional materials to
- 12 conform to the instructional materials funding levels provided by
- 13 the General Appropriations Act for the year of implementation and
- 14 to comply with Subsection (b-1).
- SECTION 4. Sections 31.101(d) and (e), Education Code, are
- 16 repealed.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
