

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the prosecution of and punishment for the offense of
3 sexual assault; enhancing a criminal penalty.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Melissa's Law.

6 SECTION 2. Sections 22.011(e) and (f), Penal Code, are
7 amended to read as follows:

8 (e) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under
9 Subsection (a)(2):

10 (1) that the actor was the spouse of the child at the
11 time of the offense; or

12 (2) that:

13 (A) the actor was not more than three years older
14 than the victim and at the time of the offense:

15 (i) was not required under Chapter 62, Code
16 of Criminal Procedure, to register for life as a sex offender; or

17 (ii) was not a person who under Chapter 62,
18 Code of Criminal Procedure, had a reportable conviction or
19 adjudication for an offense under this section; and

20 (B) the victim:

21 (i) was a child of 14 years of age or older;
22 and

23 (ii) was not:

24 (a) a person whom the actor was

1 prohibited from marrying or purporting to marry or with whom the
2 actor was prohibited from living under the appearance of being
3 married under Section [25.01](#); or

4 (b) a person with whom the actor was
5 prohibited from engaging in sexual intercourse or deviate sexual
6 intercourse under Section [25.02](#).

7 (f) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
8 degree, except that an offense under this section is a felony of the
9 first degree if the victim was:

10 (1) a person whom the actor was prohibited from
11 marrying or purporting to marry or with whom the actor was
12 prohibited from living under the appearance of being married under
13 Section [25.01](#); or

14 (2) a person with whom the actor was prohibited from
15 engaging in sexual intercourse or deviate sexual intercourse under
16 Section [25.02](#).

17 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
18 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
19 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
20 by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former
21 law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this
22 section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this
23 Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.

24 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
