2	relating to the establishment of a pilot program for the issuance of
3	digital identification.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 7, Transportation Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 526 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 526. DIGITAL IDENTIFICATION PILOT PROGRAM
8	Sec. 526.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Department" and "driver's license" have the
10	meanings assigned by Section 521.001.
11	(2) "Digital identification" includes digital
12	driver's licenses and digital personal identification
13	certificates.
14	Sec. 526.002. DIGITAL IDENTIFICATION PILOT PROGRAM. (a)
15	The department by rule shall establish a pilot program for the
16	issuance of digital identification.
17	(b) In establishing the digital identification pilot
18	program, the department shall:
19	(1) assess existing department infrastructure and
20	identify changes required to implement the program;
21	(2) upgrade department infrastructure according to
22	the department's findings under Subdivision (1);
23	(3) acquire a mobile application that:
24	(A) displays digital identification that

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1	includes the information described by Section 521.121(a) on a
2	wireless communication device;
3	(B) includes an authentication and verification
4	process for a wireless communication device; and
5	(C) may be used in any location regardless of the
6	location's level of wireless connectivity or cellular telephone
7	service;
8	(4) deploy the digital identification mobile
9	application at no cost to focus groups for testing and evaluation;
10	(5) implement a law enforcement version of the
11	application for field testing; and
12	(6) ensure that the privacy rights of pilot program
13	participants are protected.
14	(c) Digital identification issued under this section may
15	not be used or accepted as valid proof of identification.
16	(d) The department may contract with a third party to
17	establish the pilot program described by this section if the
18	contract is at no cost to the department. In contracting with a
19	third party, the department shall give a preference to vendors
20	whose principal office is located in the United States.
21	(e) The department shall prepare a report containing the
22	results of the pilot program and the department's recommendations.
23	The department shall submit the report to the Public Safety
24	Commission and the legislature not later than the 180th day after
25	the date of completion of the pilot program.
26	Sec. 526.003. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires September
27	<u>1, 2021.</u>

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1 SECTION 2. The Department of Public Safety shall adopt the 2 initial rules for the digital identification pilot program under 3 Chapter 526, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, not later 4 than February 1, 2020.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
