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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the availability of personal information of a child
- 3 protective services caseworker, adult protective services
- 4 caseworker, or investigator.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 552.117(a), Government Code, as amended
- 7 by Chapters 34 (S.B. 1576), 190 (S.B. 42), and 1006 (H.B. 1278),
- 8 Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted
- 9 and amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) Information is excepted from the requirements of
- 11 Section 552.021 if it is information that relates to the home
- 12 address, home telephone number, emergency contact information, or
- 13 social security number of the following person or that reveals
- 14 whether the person has family members:
- 15 (1) a current or former official or employee of a
- 16 governmental body, except as otherwise provided by Section 552.024;
- 17 (2) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
- 18 Criminal Procedure, or a security officer commissioned under
- 19 Section 51.212, Education Code, regardless of whether the officer
- 20 complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable;
- 21 (3) a current or former employee of the Texas
- 22 Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
- 23 the department or any division of the department, regardless of
- 24 whether the current or former employee complies with Section

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1 552.1175;
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- 2 (4) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
- 3 Criminal Procedure, or other law, a reserve law enforcement
- 4 officer, a commissioned deputy game warden, or a corrections
- 5 officer in a municipal, county, or state penal institution in this
- 6 state who was killed in the line of duty, regardless of whether the
- 7 deceased complied with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;
- 8 (5) a commissioned security officer as defined by
- 9 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, regardless of whether the
- 10 officer complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175, as applicable;
- 11 (6) an officer or employee of a community supervision
- 12 and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who
- 13 performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b), regardless of
- 14 whether the officer or employee complies with Section 552.024 or
- 15 552.1175;
- 16 (7) a current or former employee of the office of the
- 17 attorney general who is or was assigned to a division of that office
- 18 the duties of which involve law enforcement, regardless of whether
- 19 the current or former employee complies with Section 552.024 or
- 20 552.1175;
- 21 (8) a current or former employee of the Texas Juvenile
- 22 Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of the
- 23 department, regardless of whether the current or former employee
- 24 complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;
- 25 (9) a current or former juvenile probation or
- 26 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 27 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department,

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- 1 under Title 12, Human Resources Code, regardless of whether the
- 2 current or former officer complies with Section 552.024 or
- 3 552.1175;
- 4 (10) a current or former employee of a juvenile
- 5 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section
- 6 261.405, Family Code, regardless of whether the current or former
- 7 employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;
- 8 (11) a current or former member of the Texas military
- 9 forces, as that term is defined by Section 437.001;
- 10 (12) a current or former district attorney, criminal
- 11 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
- 12 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
- 13 matters, regardless of whether the current or former attorney
- 14 complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175; [or]
- 15 (13) a current or former employee of a district
- 16 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
- 17 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child
- 18 protective services matters, regardless of whether the current or
- 19 former employee complies with Section 552.024 or 552.1175;
- 20 (14) $[\frac{(12)}{}]$ a current or former employee of the Texas
- 21 Civil Commitment Office or of the predecessor in function of the
- 22 office or a division of the office, regardless of whether the
- 23 current or former employee complies with Section 552.024 or
- 24 552.1175;
- (15) $[\frac{(12)}{(12)}]$ a current or former federal judge or state
- 26 judge, as those terms are defined by Section 13.0021(a), Election
- 27 Code, or a spouse of a current or former federal judge or state

- 2 (16) a current or former child protective services
- 3 caseworker, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator
- 4 for the Department of Family and Protective Services, regardless of
- 5 whether the caseworker or investigator complies with Section
- 6 552.024 or 552.1175, or a current or former employee of a department
- 7 contractor performing child protective services caseworker, adult
- 8 protective services caseworker, or investigator functions for the
- 9 contractor on behalf of the department [(13) a current or former
- 10 district attorney, criminal district attorney, or county attorney
- 11 whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective
- 12 services matter].
- 13 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 552.1175, Government
- 14 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 552.1175. EXCEPTION: CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN
- 16 PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION OF PEACE OFFICERS AND OTHER
- 17 OFFICIALS PERFORMING SENSITIVE GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTIONS [, COUNTY
- 18 JAILERS, SECURITY OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES OF CERTAIN STATE AGENCIES OR
- 19 CERTAIN CRIMINAL OR JUVENILE JUSTICE ACENCIES OR OFFICES, AND
- 20 FEDERAL AND STATE JUDGES].
- SECTION 3. Section 552.1175(a), Government Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (a) This section applies only to:
- 24 (1) peace officers as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
- 25 Criminal Procedure;
- 26 (2) county jailers as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 27 Occupations Code;

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- 1 (3) current or former employees of the Texas
- 2 Department of Criminal Justice or of the predecessor in function of
- 3 the department or any division of the department;
- 4 (4) commissioned security officers as defined by
- 5 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;
- 6 (5) a current or former district attorney, criminal
- 7 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
- 8 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
- 9 matters;
- 10 (5-a) a current or former employee of a district
- 11 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
- 12 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child
- 13 protective services matters;
- 14 (6) officers and employees of a community supervision
- 15 and corrections department established under Chapter 76 who perform
- 16 a duty described by Section 76.004(b);
- 17 (7) criminal investigators of the United States as
- 18 described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 19 (8) police officers and inspectors of the United
- 20 States Federal Protective Service;
- 21 (9) current and former employees of the office of the
- 22 attorney general who are or were assigned to a division of that
- 23 office the duties of which involve law enforcement;
- 24 (10) current or former juvenile probation and
- 25 detention officers certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 26 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department,
- 27 under Title 12, Human Resources Code;

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- 1 (11) current or former employees of a juvenile justice
- 2 program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section 261.405,
- 3 Family Code;
- 4 (12) current or former employees of the Texas Juvenile
- 5 Justice Department or the predecessors in function of the
- 6 department;
- 7 (13) federal judges and state judges as defined by
- 8 Section 13.0021, Election Code; [and]
- 9 (14) current or former employees of the Texas Civil
- 10 Commitment Office or of the predecessor in function of the office or
- 11 a division of the office; and
- 12 <u>(15) a current or former child protective services</u>
- 13 <u>caseworker</u>, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator
- 14 for the Department of Family and Protective Services or a current or
- 15 <u>former employee of a department contractor performing child</u>
- 16 protective services caseworker, adult protective services
- 17 caseworker, or investigator functions for the contractor on behalf
- 18 of the department.
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, as amended by
- 20 Chapters 34 (S.B. 1576), 41 (S.B. 256), 193 (S.B. 510), 1006 (H.B.
- 21 1278), and 1145 (H.B. 457), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
- 22 Session, 2017, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) This section applies only to:
- 24 (1) a current or former peace officer as defined by
- 25 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, and the spouse or
- 26 surviving spouse of the peace officer;
- 27 (2) the adult child of a current peace officer as

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- 1 defined by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 2 (3) a county jailer as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 3 Occupations Code;
- 4 (4) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal
- 5 Justice;
- 6 (5) a commissioned security officer as defined by
- 7 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;
- 8 (6) an individual who shows that the individual, the
- 9 individual's child, or another person in the individual's household
- 10 is a victim of family violence as defined by Section 71.004, Family
- 11 Code, by providing:
- 12 (A) a copy of a protective order issued under
- 13 Chapter 85, Family Code, or a magistrate's order for emergency
- 14 protection issued under Article 17.292, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 15 or
- 16 (B) other independent documentary evidence
- 17 necessary to show that the individual, the individual's child, or
- 18 another person in the individual's household is a victim of family
- 19 violence;
- (7) $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ an individual who shows that the individual,
- 21 the individual's child, or another person in the individual's
- 22 household is a victim of sexual assault or abuse, stalking, or
- 23 trafficking of persons by providing:
- 24 (A) a copy of a protective order issued under
- 25 Chapter 7A or Article 6.09, Code of Criminal Procedure, or a
- 26 magistrate's order for emergency protection issued under Article
- 27 17.292, Code of Criminal Procedure; or

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- 1 (B) other independent documentary evidence
- 2 necessary to show that the individual, the individual's child, or
- 3 another person in the individual's household is a victim of sexual
- 4 assault or abuse, stalking, or trafficking of persons;
- 5 (8) $\left[\frac{(7)}{1}\right]$ a participant in the address
- 6 confidentiality program administered by the attorney general under
- 7 Subchapter C, Chapter 56, Code of Criminal Procedure, who provides
- 8 proof of certification under Article 56.84, Code of Criminal
- 9 Procedure;
- 10 $\underline{(9)}$ [$\overline{(8)}$] a federal judge, a state judge, or the
- 11 spouse of a federal judge or state judge;
- 12 (10) a current or former district attorney, criminal
- 13 district attorney, or county or municipal attorney whose
- 14 jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child protective services
- 15 matters;
- (11) $[\frac{(9)}{}]$ a current or former employee of a district
- 17 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
- 18 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child
- 19 protective services matters;
- 20 (12) (10) an officer or employee of a community
- 21 supervision and corrections department established under Chapter
- 22 76, Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section
- 23 76.004(b) of that code;
- (13) $\left[\frac{(11)}{(11)}\right]$ a criminal investigator of the United
- 25 States as described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal
- 26 Procedure;
- (14) $\left[\frac{(12)}{(12)}\right]$ a police officer or inspector of the

- 1 United States Federal Protective Service;
- 2 (15) [(13)] a current or former United States attorney
- 3 or assistant United States attorney and the spouse and child of the
- 4 attorney;
- 5 (16) $[\frac{(14)}{(14)}]$ a current or former employee of the office
- 6 of the attorney general who is or was assigned to a division of that
- 7 office the duties of which involve law enforcement;
- 8 (17) $[\frac{(15)}{(15)}]$ a medical examiner or person who performs
- 9 forensic analysis or testing who is employed by this state or one or
- 10 more political subdivisions of this state;
- (18) $[\frac{(16)}{}]$ a current or former member of the United
- 12 States armed forces who has served in an area that the president of
- 13 the United States by executive order designates for purposes of 26
- 14 U.S.C. Section 112 as an area in which armed forces of the United
- 15 States are or have engaged in combat;
- (19) $[\frac{(17)}{}]$ a current or former employee of the Texas
- 17 Juvenile Justice Department or of the predecessors in function of
- 18 the department;
- 19 (20) [(18)] a current or former juvenile probation or
- 20 supervision officer certified by the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 21 Department, or the predecessors in function of the department,
- 22 under Title 12, Human Resources Code;
- 23 $\underline{(21)}$ [$\frac{(19)}{}$] a current or former employee of a juvenile
- 24 justice program or facility, as those terms are defined by Section
- 25 261.405, Family Code; [and]
- (22) $[\frac{(18)}{}]$ a current or former employee of the Texas
- 27 Civil Commitment Office or of the predecessor in function of the

- 1 office or a division of the office;
- 2 (23) [(18)] a current or former employee of a federal
- 3 judge or state judge; and
- 4 (24) a current or former child protective services
- 5 caseworker, adult protective services caseworker, or investigator
- 6 for the Department of Family and Protective Services or a current or
- 7 former employee of a department contractor performing child
- 8 protective services caseworker, adult protective services
- 9 caseworker, or investigator functions for the contractor on behalf
- 10 of the department.
- 11 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 12 552.117 and 552.1175, Government Code, and Section 25.025, Tax
- 13 Code, apply only to a request for information that is received by a
- 14 governmental body or an officer on or after the effective date of
- 15 this Act. A request for information that was received before the
- 16 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 17 date the request was received, and the former law is continued in
- 18 effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 6. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 20 over another Act of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019,
- 21 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 22 codes.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
