A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to the punishment for the criminal offense of theft 2 involving a package delivered to or collected from a residential or 3 commercial property; increasing a criminal penalty. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 31.03, Penal Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d-1) and amending Subsection (e) to read as follows: 7 (d-1) It is not a defense to prosecution of an offense 8 punishable under Subsection (e)(3)(B) that the package is addressed 9 to a person who is not the owner of the residential or commercial 10 property from which the package was stolen. 11 12 (e) Except as provided by Subsection (f), an offense under 13 this section is: 14 (1) a Class C misdemeanor if the value of the property stolen is less than \$100; 15 a Class B misdemeanor if: 16 (2) (A) the value of the property stolen is \$100 or 17 more but less than \$750; 18 the value of the property stolen is less than 19 (B) \$100 and the defendant has previously been convicted of any grade of 20 21 theft; or 22 (C) the property stolen is a driver's license, commercial 23 driver's license, or personal identification certificate issued by this state or another state; 24

1 (3) a Class A misdemeanor if: 2 (A) the value of the property stolen is \$750 or 3 more but less than \$2,500; or 4 (B) the value of the property stolen is less than 5 \$2,500 and the property is a package that: 6 (i) has been delivered by a common carrier 7 but not yet received by the addressee or has been left to be 8 collected for delivery by a common carrier; and 9 (ii) is stolen from a residential or 10 commercial property, including the driveway, porch, front door, or any other area of the property; 11 (4) a state jail felony if: 12 the value of the property stolen is \$2,500 or 13 (A) more but less than \$30,000, or the property is less than 10 head of 14 sheep, swine, or goats or any part thereof under the value of 15 \$30,000; 16 17 (B) regardless of value, the property is stolen from the person of another or from a human corpse or grave, 18 19 including property that is a military grave marker; 20 (C) the property stolen is a firearm, as defined by Section 46.01; 21 the value of the property stolen is less than 22 (D) 23 \$2,500 and the defendant has been previously convicted two or more 24 times of any grade of theft; (E) the property stolen is an official ballot or 25 26 official carrier envelope for an election; or 27 (F) the value of the property stolen is less than

1 \$20,000 and the property stolen is: 2 (i) aluminum; 3 (ii) bronze; (iii) copper; or 4 5 (iv) brass; 6 (5) a felony of the third degree if the value of the 7 property stolen is \$30,000 or more but less than \$150,000, or the 8 property is: 9 (A) cattle, horses, or exotic livestock or exotic fowl as defined by Section 142.001, Agriculture Code, stolen during 10 a single transaction and having an aggregate value of less than 11 \$150,000; 12 (B) 10 or more head of sheep, swine, or goats 13 14 stolen during a single transaction and having an aggregate value of 15 less than \$150,000; or 16 (C) a controlled substance, having a value of 17 less than \$150,000, if stolen from: (i) a commercial building in 18 which а controlled substance is generally stored, including a pharmacy, 19 clinic, hospital, nursing facility, or warehouse; or 20 21 (ii) a vehicle owned or operated by a wholesale distributor of prescription drugs; 22 23 (6) a felony of the second degree if: 24 (A) the value of the property stolen is \$150,000 or more but less than \$300,000; or 25 the value of the property stolen is less than 26 (B) 27 \$300,000 and the property stolen is an automated teller machine or

1 the contents or components of an automated teller machine; or

2 (7) a felony of the first degree if the value of the3 property stolen is \$300,000 or more.

4 SECTION 2. Section 31.03(h), Penal Code, is amended by 5 adding Subdivision (7) to read as follows:

6 (7) "Package" means a box, container, bag, or other
7 sealed article holding a good or product.

8 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, 11 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 12 For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 13 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 14 15 before that date.
