A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the act of smoking tobacco in a vehicle with a child

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 161.501(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A hospital, birthing center, physician, nurse midwife,
- 9 or midwife who provides prenatal care to a pregnant woman during
- 10 gestation or at delivery of an infant shall:
- 11 (1) provide the woman and the father of the infant, if
- 12 possible, or another adult caregiver for the infant, with a
- 13 resource pamphlet that includes:
- 14 (A) a list of the names, addresses, and phone
- 15 numbers of professional organizations that provide postpartum
- 16 counseling and assistance to parents relating to postpartum
- 17 depression and other emotional trauma associated with pregnancy and
- 18 parenting;
- 19 (B) information regarding the prevention of
- 20 shaken baby syndrome including:
- 21 (i) techniques for coping with anger caused
- 22 by a crying baby;
- 23 (ii) different methods for preventing a
- 24 person from shaking a newborn, infant, or other young child;

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- 1 (iii) the dangerous effects of shaking a
- 2 newborn, infant, or other young child; and
- 3 (iv) the symptoms of shaken baby syndrome
- 4 and who to contact, as recommended by the American Academy of
- 5 Pediatrics, if a parent suspects or knows that a baby has been
- 6 shaken in order to receive prompt medical treatment;
- 7 (C) a list of diseases for which a child is
- 8 required by state law to be immunized and the appropriate schedule
- 9 for the administration of those immunizations;
- 10 (D) the appropriate schedule for follow-up
- 11 procedures for newborn screening;
- 12 (E) information regarding sudden infant death
- 13 syndrome, including current recommendations for infant sleeping
- 14 conditions to lower the risk of sudden infant death syndrome;
- 15 (F) educational information in both English and
- 16 Spanish on:
- 17 (i) pertussis disease and the availability
- 18 of a vaccine to protect against pertussis, including information on
- 19 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendation that
- 20 parents receive Tdap during the postpartum period to protect
- 21 newborns from the transmission of pertussis; and
- 22 (ii) the incidence of cytomegalovirus,
- 23 birth defects caused by congenital cytomegalovirus, and available
- 24 resources for the family of an infant born with congenital
- 25 cytomegalovirus; [and]
- 26 (G) the danger of heatstroke for a child left
- 27 unattended in a motor vehicle; and

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SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 542, Transportation Code,

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- 1 is amended by adding Section 542.4041 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 542.4041. OFFENSE WHILE SMOKING TOBACCO WITH CHILD
- 3 PRESENT IN VEHICLE; FINE AUTHORIZED. In addition to the fine
- 4 prescribed by Section 542.401 or another section of this subtitle,
- 5 as applicable, a person who enters a plea of guilty or nolo
- 6 contendere to or is convicted of an offense under this subtitle
- 7 shall either, as prescribed by the judge, pay a \$15 fine or complete
- 8 <u>a parenting class approved by the judge if the offense is committed</u>
- 9 while:
- 10 (1) the person possesses a burning tobacco product or
- 11 smokes tobacco in a vehicle; and
- 12 (2) a child is present in the vehicle who is required
- 13 to be secured in a child passenger safety seat system during the
- 14 operation of the vehicle under Section 545.412.
- SECTION 3. (a) Not later than December 1, 2019, the
- 16 Department of State Health Services shall make the informational
- 17 materials required by Section 161.501(a)(1), Health and Safety
- 18 Code, as amended by this Act, available on its Internet website.
- 19 (b) Notwithstanding Section 161.501(a)(1)(H), Health and
- 20 Safety Code, as added by this Act, a facility is not required to
- 21 comply with that provision until January 1, 2020.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
