To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 19 over another Act of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, 20 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 21 22 codes. 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
