5 SECTION 1. Section 32.003, Family Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (g) to read as 7 follows:

8 (a) A child may consent to medical, dental, psychological, 9 and surgical treatment for the child by a licensed physician or 10 dentist if the child:

(1) is on active duty with the armed services of the

(3) consents to the diagnosis and treatment of an
infectious, contagious, or communicable disease that is required by

3 (4) is unmarried and pregnant and consents to
4 hospital, medical, or surgical treatment, other than abortion,
5 related to the pregnancy;

6 (5) consents to examination and treatment for drug or 7 chemical addiction, drug or chemical dependency, or any other 8 condition directly related to drug or chemical use;

9 (6) is unmarried, is the parent of a child, and has 10 actual custody of his or her child and consents to medical, dental, 11 psychological, or surgical treatment for the child; [or]

(7) is serving a term of confinement in a facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, unless the treatment would constitute a prohibited practice under Section 164.052(a)(19), Occupations Code; or

16 (8) is unmarried, is the mother of a child, and 17 consents to examination or contraception-related medical 18 treatment, other than abortion.

19 (g) In this section, "contraception" means any reversible 20 method of preventing pregnancy that is approved by the United 21 <u>States Food and Drug Administration.</u>
