| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 545, Transportation Code, |
| 6 | is amended by adding Section 545.0571 to read as follows: |
| 7 | Sec. 545.0571. MOTOR VEHICLE PASSING PEDESTRIAN OR BICYCLE |
| 8 | OPERATOR. (a) An operator of a motor vehicle shall exercise due |
| 9 | care to avoid colliding with a pedestrian or a person operating a |
| 10 | bicycle on a highway or street. |
| 11 | (b) For the purposes of Section 545.053(a), safe distance |
| 12 | from a pedestrian or any part of a bicycle is: |
| 13 | (1) at least three feet if the operator's vehicle is a |
| 14 | passenger car or a light truck; or |
| 15 | (2) at least six feet if the operator's vehicle is a |

- commercial motor vehicle as defined by Section 522.003 or a truck 16
- 17 other than a light truck.
- (c) For the purposes of Section 545.057(a), conditions 18
- 19 permit safely passing a pedestrian or a bicycle to the right only if
- 20 the motor vehicle passes:
- 21 (1) at least three feet from the pedestrian or any part
- of the bicycle if the operator's vehicle is a passenger car or a 22
- 23 light truck; or
- 24 (2) at least six feet from the pedestrian or any part

- 1 of the bicycle if the operator's vehicle is a commercial motor
- 2 vehicle as defined by Section 522.003 or a truck other than a light
- 3 truck.
- 4 (d) An operator of a motor vehicle passing a pedestrian or a
- 5 person operating a bicycle on a highway or street that has two or
- 6 more marked lanes running in the same direction shall move the motor
- 7 vehicle to a lane other than the lane used by the pedestrian or
- 8 bicycle operator while passing the pedestrian or bicycle operator.
- 9 (e) A collision of a motor vehicle with a pedestrian or a
- 10 person operating a bicycle is prima facie evidence that the
- 11 operator of the motor vehicle violated this section, Section
- 12 545.053, Section 545.054, or Section 545.057, as applicable.
- 13 (f) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this
- 14 section that at the time of the offense the pedestrian or bicycle
- 15 operator was acting in violation of a traffic law.
- SECTION 2. Section 545.055, Transportation Code, is amended
- 17 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 18 follows:
- 19 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), an [An] operator
- 20 may not drive on the left side of the roadway in a no-passing zone or
- 21 on the left side of any pavement striping designed to mark a
- 22 no-passing zone.
- 23 (b-1) Subsection (b) [This subsection] does not prohibit a
- 24 driver from:
- 25 (1) crossing pavement striping, or the center line in
- 26 a no-passing zone marked by signs only, to make a left turn into or
- 27 out of an alley or private road or driveway; or

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- 1 (2) passing a pedestrian or a person operating a
- 2 bicycle in a no-passing zone if the operator of the motor vehicle
- 3 otherwise complies with the requirements of this chapter.
- 4 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 6 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 7 by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the
- 8 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 9 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
- 10 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
