5	SECTION 1. Section 11.159, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
7	(e) The State Board of Education shall require a trustee to
8	complete training provided by the Texas School Safety Center on
9	school safety and security every three years. A new trustee must

- 10 complete the training required by this section not later than the 11 first anniversary of the trustee's election or appointment. A
- 12 returning trustee must complete the training not later than the
- 13 third anniversary of completion of the trustee's previous training.
- SECTION 2. Section 12.104(b), Education Code, as amended by
- 15 Chapters 324 (S.B. 1488), 522 (S.B. 179), and 735 (S.B. 1153), Acts
- 16 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and

          SECTION 3. Section 12.123, Education Code, is amended by

    adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
          (c) The commissioner shall require a member of the governing
20
   body of an open-enrollment charter school to complete training
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   provided by the Texas School Safety Center on school safety and
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security every three years. A new member must complete the training

required by this section not later than the first anniversary of the

date the member begins to serve on the governing body. A member

must complete subsequent training not later than the third

anniversary of completion of the member's previous training.

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- 1 SECTION 4. Section 37.108, Education Code, is amended by
- 2 amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (c-1) and adding Subsection
- 3 (a-1) to read as follows:
- 4 (a) Each school district or public junior college district
- 5 shall adopt and implement a multihazard emergency operations plan
- 6 for use in the district's facilities. The plan must address
- 7 mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery as defined by the
- 8 commissioner of education or commissioner of higher education in
- 9 conjunction with the governor's office of homeland security. The
- 10 plan must provide for:
- 11 (1) district employee training in responding to an
- 12 emergency;
- 13 (2) the establishment of a threat assessment team as
- 14 required by Section 37.1091;
- 15 <u>(3)</u> if the plan applies to a school district,
- 16 mandatory school drills and exercises specified by the Texas School
- 17 Safety Center to prepare district students and employees for
- 18 responding to an emergency;
- 19 (4) an annual review of the plan in accordance with
- 20 guidelines established by the Texas School Safety Center [(3)
- 21 measures to ensure coordination with the Department of State Health
- 22 Services and local emergency management agencies, law enforcement,
- 23 health departments, and fire departments in the event of an
- 24 emergency]; and
- (5) $\left[\frac{(4)}{1}\right]$ the implementation of a safety and security
- 26 audit as required by Subsection (b).
- 27 (a-1) In developing a multihazard emergency operations plan

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- 1 under Subsection (a), a school district or public junior college
- 2 district shall consult with the Department of State Health Services
- 3 and local emergency management agencies, law enforcement, health
- 4 departments, and fire departments. The plan must include a list of
- 5 persons with which the district consulted in preparing the plan,
- 6 including each person's name, title, and affiliated entity.
- 7 (b) At least once every three years, each school district or
- 8 public junior college district shall conduct a safety and security
- 9 audit of the district's facilities. A [To the extent possible, a]
- 10 district shall follow safety and security audit procedures
- 11 developed by the Texas School Safety Center [or a comparable public
- 12 or private entity].
- 13 (c) A school district or public junior college district
- 14 shall report the results of the safety and security audit conducted
- 15 under Subsection (b) to the district's board of trustees <u>not later</u>
- 16 than the 60th day after the conclusion of each audit cycle under
- 17 Subsection (b) and, in the manner required by the Texas School
- 18 Safety Center, to the Texas School Safety Center.
- 19 (c-1) Any [Except as provided by Subsection (c-2), any]
- 20 document or information collected, developed, or produced during a
- 21 safety and security audit conducted under Subsection (b) is not
- 22 subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.
- SECTION 5. The heading to Section 37.109, Education Code,
- 24 is amended to read as follows:

- 26 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR.
- SECTION 6. Section 37.109, Education Code, is amended by

- 1 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 2 (c) Each school district shall appoint an employee of the
- 3 district to serve as the district's emergency management
- 4 coordinator. The emergency management coordinator shall:
- 5 (1) serve as the presiding officer of the committee;
- 6 (2) ensure the committee performs the committee's
- 7 <u>obligations under Subsection (b); and</u>
- 8 <u>(3) supervise the development and implementation of</u>
- 9 the district multihazard emergency operations plan required by
- 10 Section 37.108(a), including:
- 11 (A) the coordination of employee training in
- 12 responding to an emergency; and
- 13 (B) the execution and documentation of mandatory
- 14 school drills and exercises.
- 15 SECTION 7. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 37.1091 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 37.1091. THREAT ASSESSMENT TEAM. (a) Each school
- 18 district shall adopt policies and procedures in accordance with the
- 19 guidelines developed by the Texas School Safety Center, and in
- 20 coordination with the agency, for the establishment of threat
- 21 assessment teams. The policies and procedures must establish at
- 22 least one threat assessment team and:
- (1) the membership and composition of each threat
- 24 <u>assessment team;</u>
- 25 (2) the training requirements for a member of a threat
- 26 <u>assessment team</u>, including training provided by the Texas School
- 27 Safety Center in threat assessment protocols;

- 1 (3) guidance for students, faculty, and staff in
- 2 identifying and reporting of any threatening or aberrant behavior
- 3 that may pose a threat to the community, school, or individual; and
- 4 (4) the process for threat assessment, management,
- 5 investigation, and response.
- 6 (b) A threat assessment team identifying a student at risk
- 7 of suicide shall act in accordance with the district's suicide
- 8 prevention program.
- 9 (c) Each threat assessment team established under
- 10 Subsection (a) shall annually report to the Texas School Safety
- 11 Center the policies and procedures adopted by the team.
- 12 SECTION 8. Section 37.108(c-2), Education Code, is
- 13 repealed.
- 14 SECTION 9. A person serving on the board of trustees of a
- 15 school district or the governing body of an open-enrollment charter
- 16 school on the effective date of this Act must complete the training
- 17 required by Section 11.159(e) or 12.123(c), Education Code, as
- 18 added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2020.
- 19 SECTION 10. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 20 over another Act of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019,
- 21 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 22 codes.
- 23 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
