A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to notice to a prospective residential tenant regarding
3	flooding and flood insurance.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 92, Property Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 92.0132 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 92.0132. NOTICE REGARDING FLOODING AND FLOOD
8	INSURANCE. (a) A landlord shall provide to a tenant a written
9	notice substantially equivalent to the following:
10	"This dwelling may be located in an area of land designated by
11	the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as susceptible to
12	flooding. FEMA maintains a flood map service center on its Internet
13	website that the public may search by address, at no cost, to
14	determine if a dwelling is located in a flood hazard area. Most
15	tenant insurance policies do not cover damages or loss incurred in a
16	flood event. You should seek appropriate insurance coverage that
17	would cover losses caused by a flood."
18	(b) The notice required by Subsection (a) must be included
19	<u>in:</u>
20	(1) a written lease and printed in underlined or
21	boldfaced type; or
22	(2) a separate written document given to the tenant
23	before execution of the lease.
24	(c) If a landlord violates this section and a tenant suffers

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- 1 loss or damage to the tenant's personal property as a result of
- 2 flood, the tenant may terminate the lease by providing written
- 3 <u>notice of termination to the landlord.</u>
- 4 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 a lease entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 6 lease entered into before that date is governed by the law
- 7 applicable to the lease immediately before the effective date of
- 8 this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 9 purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
