5	SECTION 1. Chapter 438, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E. CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION CERTIFICATION FOR
8	CERTAIN FOOD SERVICE EMPLOYEES
9	Sec. 438.051. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "food
10	service establishment" has the meaning assigned by Section 437.001.
11	Sec. 438.052. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only
12	to a food service establishment with a space designed for food
13	consumption on the premises of the establishment.
14	Sec. 438.053. CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION CERTIFICATION.
15	(a) A food service establishment may require each establishment
16	employee whose position requires regular interaction with
17	customers consuming food on the establishment's premises to hold a
18	certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The establishment
19	is not required to reimburse an employee for the cost of obtaining
20	the certification.
21	(b) The instructor of a training course for the
22	certification required under this section must be authorized to
23	provide the training by the American Heart Association, the
24	American Red Cross, or a similar nationally recognized association.
