Section 27.031(a), Government Code, is amended 12 to read as follows: (a) In addition to the jurisdiction and powers provided by 13 the constitution and other law, the justice court has original 14 jurisdiction of: 15 (1) civil matters in which exclusive jurisdiction is 16 not in the district or county court and in which the amount in 17 controversy is not more than <u>\$20,000</u> [\$10,000], exclusive of 18 19 interest; 20 (2) cases of forcible entry and detainer; 21 (3) foreclosure of mortgages and enforcement of liens on personal property in cases in which the amount in controversy is 22 23 otherwise within the justice court's jurisdiction; and 24 (4) cases arising under Chapter 707, Transportation

1 Code, outside a municipality's territorial limits.

2 SECTION 3. This Act applies only to a cause of action filed 3 on or after the effective date of this Act. A cause of action filed 4 before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before 5 that date, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
