A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the mental health first aid training program reporting requirements. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 1001.205, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 1001.205. REPORTS. (a) Not later than September 30 of each year, a local mental health authority shall provide to the 8 9 department the number of: employees and contractors of the authority who 10 (1)11 were trained as mental health first aid trainers under Section 12 1001.202 during the preceding fiscal year, the number of trainers who left the program for any reason during the preceding fiscal 13 14 year, and the number of active trainers; university employees, school district employees, 15 (2) and school resource officers who completed a mental health first 16 aid training program offered by the authority under Section 17 1001.203 during the preceding fiscal year categorized by local 18 mental health authority region, school district, and category of 19 personnel; and 20 21 (3) individuals who are not university employees, 22 district employees, or school school resource officers who 23 completed a mental health first aid training program offered by the

24 authority during the preceding fiscal year.

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1 (b) Not later than December 1 of each year, the department 2 shall compile the information submitted by local mental health 3 authorities as required by Subsection (a) and submit a report to the 4 legislature containing [the number of]:

5 (1) <u>the number of</u> authority employees and contractors 6 trained as mental health first aid trainers during the preceding 7 fiscal year, the number of trainers who left the program for any 8 <u>reason during the preceding fiscal year, and the number of active</u> 9 <u>trainers;</u>

10 (2) the number of university employees, school district employees, and school resource officers who completed a 11 12 mental health first aid training program provided by an authority during the preceding fiscal year categorized by local mental health 13 14 authority region, school district, and category of personnel; [and] 15 (3) the number of individuals who are not university 16 employees, school district employees, or school resource officers 17 who completed a mental health first aid training program provided by an authority during the preceding fiscal year; and 18

19 (4) a detailed accounting of expenditures of money
20 appropriated for the purpose of implementing this subchapter.

SECTION 2. (a) Section 1001.205(a), Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a report due under that subsection after September 30, 2019. A report due under that subsection before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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(b) Section 1001.205(b), Health and Safety Code, as amended

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by this Act, applies only to a report due under that subsection after December 1, 2019. A report due under that subsection before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
