1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the mental health first aid training program reporting  
1-22 requirements.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 1001.205, Health and Safety Code, is  
1-25 amended to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 1001.205. REPORTS. (a) Not later than September 30 of  
1-27 each year, a local mental health authority shall provide to the  
1-28 department the number of:

1-29 (1) employees and contractors of the authority who  
1-30 were trained as mental health first aid trainers under Section  
1-31 1001.202 during the preceding fiscal year, the number of trainers  
1-32 who left the program for any reason during the preceding fiscal  
1-33 year, and the number of active trainers;

1-34 (2) university employees, school district employees,  
1-35 and school resource officers who completed a mental health first  
1-36 aid training program offered by the authority under Section  
1-37 1001.203 during the preceding fiscal year categorized by local  
1-38 mental health authority region, university or school district, as  
1-39 applicable, and category of personnel; and

1-40 (3) individuals who are not university employees,  
1-41 school district employees, or school resource officers who  
1-42 completed a mental health first aid training program offered by the  
1-43 authority during the preceding fiscal year.

1-44 (b) Not later than December 1 of each year, the department  
1-45 shall compile the information submitted by local mental health  
1-46 authorities as required by Subsection (a) and submit a report to the  
1-47 legislature containing ~~the number of~~:

1-48 (1) the number of authority employees and contractors  
1-49 trained as mental health first aid trainers during the preceding  
1-50 fiscal year, the number of trainers who left the program for any  
1-51 reason during the preceding fiscal year, and the number of active  
1-52 trainers;

1-53 (2) the number of university employees, school  
1-54 district employees, and school resource officers who completed a  
1-55 mental health first aid training program provided by an authority  
1-56 during the preceding fiscal year categorized by local mental health  
1-57 authority region, university or school district, as applicable, and  
1-58 category of personnel; ~~and~~

1-59 (3) the number of individuals who are not university  
1-60 employees, school district employees, or school resource officers

2-1 who completed a mental health first aid training program provided  
2-2 by an authority during the preceding fiscal year; and

2-3 (4) a detailed accounting of expenditures of money  
2-4 appropriated for the purpose of implementing this subchapter.

2-5 (c) The department shall develop and provide to local mental  
2-6 health authorities a form to be used for the reporting of  
2-7 information required under Subsection (a), including the reporting  
2-8 of each category of personnel described by that subsection.

2-9 SECTION 2. (a) Section 1001.205(a), Health and Safety  
2-10 Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a report due under  
2-11 that subsection after December 31, 2019. A report due under that  
2-12 subsection before that date is governed by the law in effect  
2-13 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is  
2-14 continued in effect for that purpose.

2-15 (b) Section 1001.205(b), Health and Safety Code, as amended  
2-16 by this Act, applies only to a report due under that subsection  
2-17 after March 1, 2020. A report due under that subsection before that  
2-18 date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the  
2-19 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for  
2-20 that purpose.

2-21 (c) Not later than May 1, 2020, the Health and Human  
2-22 Services Commission shall develop and make available the form  
2-23 required under Section 1001.205(c), Health and Safety Code, as  
2-24 added by this Act.

2-25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect December 1, 2019.

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
