## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 8, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter E to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER E. MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE RESOURCES FOR
8	SCHOOL DISTRICT PERSONNEL
9	Sec. 8.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter, "local mental
10	health authority" and "non-physician mental health professional"
11	have the meanings assigned by Section 571.003, Health and Safety
12	<u>Code.</u>
13	Sec. 8.152. EMPLOYMENT OF NON-PHYSICIAN MENTAL HEALTH
14	PROFESSIONAL AS MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE RESOURCE. (a)
15	local mental health authority shall employ a non-physician mental
16	health professional to serve as a mental health and substance use
17	resource for school districts located in the region served by a
18	regional education service center and in which the local mental
19	health authority provides services.
20	(b) If two or more local mental health authorities provide
21	services in a region served by a regional education service center,
22	the local mental health authority that primarily operates in the
23	county in which the center is located shall employ the
24	non-physician mental health professional and, in making any hiring

- 2 providing services in that region.
- 3 Sec. 8.153. INTERAGENCY COLLABORATION; MEMORANDUM OF
- 4 UNDERSTANDING. (a) A local mental health authority that employs a
- 5 non-physician mental health professional under Section 8.152 and
- 6 the regional education service center shall collaborate in carrying
- 7 out this subchapter.
- 8 (b) Each regional education service center shall provide
- 9 for a non-physician mental health professional employed for the
- 10 region served by the center with a space for the professional to
- 11 carry out the professional's duties under Section 8.155. The local
- 12 mental health authority that employs the professional shall pay the
- 13 center a reasonable administrative cost for providing the space.
- (c) A local mental health authority and a regional education
- 15 <u>service center may enter into a memorandum of understanding for the</u>
- 16 <u>administration of this section.</u>
- 17 Sec. 8.154. SUPERVISION OF NON-PHYSICIAN MENTAL HEALTH
- 18 PROFESSIONAL. The local mental health authority that employs a
- 19 non-physician mental health professional under Section 8.152
- 20 shall:
- 21 (1) supervise the professional in carrying out the
- 22 professional's duties under Section 8.155; and
- 23 (2) consult with any other local mental health
- 24 authorities in the region in supervising the professional.
- Sec. 8.155. DUTIES OF NON-PHYSICIAN MENTAL HEALTH
- 26 PROFESSIONAL. (a) A non-physician mental health professional
- 27 employed under Section 8.152 shall act as a resource for school

1 district personnel by: 2 (1) helping personnel gain awareness and a better 3 understanding of mental health and co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders; 4 5 (2) assisting personnel to implement initiatives related to mental health or substance use under state law or agency 6 7 rules; 8 (3) ensuring personnel are aware of: (A) the list of recommended best practice-based 9 10 programs and research-based practices developed under Section 11 161.325, Health and Safety Code; and 12 (B) other treatment programs available in the school district, including programs provided by a local mental 13 14 health authority; 15 (4) on a bimonthly basis, providing personnel with mental health first aid training; 16 17 (5) on a bimonthly basis, providing personnel with training on prevention and intervention programs that have been 18 19 shown to be effective in helping students cope with pressures to: (A) use alcohol, cigarettes, or illegal drugs; or 20 21 (B) misuse prescription drugs; and 22 (6) on an annual basis, providing personnel with training regarding the effects of grief and trauma and providing 23 24 support to children with intellectual or developmental disabilities who suffer from grief or trauma. 25 26 (b) A non-physician mental health professional employed under Section 8.152 may not treat or provide counseling to a student 27

- 1 or provide specific advice to school district personnel regarding a
- 2 student.
- 3 Sec. 8.156. PARTICIPATION BY SCHOOL DISTRICT NOT REQUIRED.
- 4 This subchapter does not require a school district to participate
- 5 in training provided by a non-physician mental health professional
- 6 or otherwise use the professional as a resource.
- 7 Sec. 8.157. DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDING. A state agency to
- 8 which money is appropriated to carry out this subchapter shall
- 9 ensure that the money is distributed equally among the local mental
- 10 health authorities that employ and supervise non-physician mental
- 11 health professionals under this subchapter.
- 12 Sec. 8.158. REPORT. (a) Before the last business day of
- 13 each calendar year, each local mental health authority that employs
- 14 and supervises a non-physician mental health professional under
- 15 this subchapter shall prepare and submit a report to the Health and
- 16 <u>Human Services Commission regarding the outcomes for school</u>
- 17 districts and students resulting from services provided by the
- 18 non-physician mental health professional.
- 19 (b) Not later than January 31 of the following calendar
- 20 year, the commission shall compile the information submitted under
- 21 this section and prepare and submit a report to the lieutenant
- 22 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, each
- 23 standing committee of the legislature having primary jurisdiction
- 24 over mental health, and each standing committee of the legislature
- 25 having primary jurisdiction over public education.
- 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
