- 9 SECTION 2. Section 49.08(b), Penal Code, is amended to read

- 12 under this section is a felony of the <u>first</u> [second] degree.
- SECTION 3. Sections 49.09(b-1) and (b-4), Penal Code, are

- 1 (b-4) An offense under Section 49.07 is a felony of the
- 2 <u>first</u> [second] degree if it is shown on the trial of the offense
- 3 that the person caused serious bodily injury to another in the
- 4 nature of a traumatic brain injury that results in a persistent
- 5 vegetative state.
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 49.09(b-2), Penal Code, is repealed.
- 7 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 11 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 12 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 13 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 14 committed before that date.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
