8	(1) "Livestock animal" means an equine animal or an
9	animal raised primarily for use as food for human consumption or to
10	produce fiber for human use and includes horses, cattle, sheep,
11	swine, goats, and poultry.
12	(2) "Pet" means a domesticated animal, including a cat
13	or dog, that is owned by an individual and kept in or near the
14	household of the individual for the primary purpose of
15	companionship. The term does not include a livestock animal.
16	Sec. 2005.002. CERTAIN CONTRACTS FOR TRANSFER OF PET
17	PROHIBITED. (a) A contract for the transfer of a pet or financing
18	for the transfer of a pet may not:
19	(1) make ownership of the pet contingent upon the
20	buyer making payments after the transfer of possession of the pet to
21	the buyer;
22	(2) provide for the lease of a pet with the option to
23	purchase the pet at the end of the lease term; or
24	(3) authorize the use of the pet as collateral that may

1 be repossessed by the seller.

2 (b) This section does not prohibit the purchase of a pet 3 using an unsecured personal loan.

<u>Sec. 2005.003. CERTAIN CONTRACTS VOID. A contract entered</u>
<u>into in violation of this chapter is void.</u>

6 SECTION 2. Chapter 2005, Business & Commerce Code, as added 7 by this Act, applies only to a contract for the transfer of a pet 8 entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. A contract 9 for the transfer of a pet entered into before the effective date of 10 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the contract is 11 entered into, and the former law is continued in effect for that 12 purpose.
