4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 5, Insurance Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 526 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 526. CONSUMER HEALTH COVERAGE EDUCATION
8	Sec. 526.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Agent" means a person who may act as an agent for
10	the sale of a health benefit plan under a license issued under Title
11	<u>13.</u>
12	(2) "Individual health benefit plan" means:
13	(A) an individual accident and health insurance
14	policy to which Chapter 1201 applies; or
15	(B) individual health maintenance organization
16	coverage.
17	Sec. 526.002. PROVISION OF REQUIRED INFORMATION. (a) A
18	health benefit plan issuer that offers an individual health benefit
19	plan shall provide health coverage information adopted by the
20	commissioner under Section 526.003 to each agent who acts on behalf
21	of the health benefit plan issuer with respect to the sale of the
22	individual health benefit plan.
23	(b) An agent who receives health coverage information
24	described by Subsection (a) from a health benefit plan issuer may

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1	not sell or receive an application for an individual health benefit
2	plan issued by the health benefit plan issuer until the agent
3	provides the health coverage information to the prospective
4	purchaser of the individual health benefit plan.
5	Sec. 526.003. RULES. (a) The commissioner by rule shall
6	adopt the form and content of the health coverage information
7	required under Section 526.002.
8	(b) The health coverage information adopted under
9	Subsection (a) must be designed to educate a prospective purchaser
10	of an individual health benefit plan about policy and coverage
11	provisions, including copayments, deductibles, and coinsurance,
12	provider networks, and financial responsibilities for in-network
13	and out-of-network services.

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- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect January 1, 2020.
