## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 66.111(b), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to:
- 8 (1) a fish, other than a bass of the genus Micropterus,
- 9 reared in private water under a fish farmer's license;
- 10 (2) a fish possessed legally outside this state and
- 11 transported into this state;
- 12 (3) bass of the genus Micropterus reared in private
- 13 water under a fish farmer's license and marketed for the purpose of
- 14 stocking the water of this state;
- 15 (4) nongame fish regulated under Chapter 67 of this
- 16 code;
- 17 (5) channel catfish of more than 14 inches in length or
- 18 blue catfish of more than 14 inches in length taken from the public
- 19 fresh water of Angelina, Bowie, Camp, Cass, Chambers, Franklin,
- 20 Freestone, Gregg, Hardin, Harris, Harrison, Jasper, Jefferson,
- 21 Lamar, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Marion, Montgomery, Morris,
- 22 Nacogdoches, Navarro, Newton, Orange, Panola, Polk, Red River,
- 23 Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Shelby, Titus, Trinity, Tyler,
- 24 Upshur, or Walker County, the public fresh water of the Neches or

- 5 SECTION 2. Title 7, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Chapter 351 to read as follows:
- 7 <u>CHAPTER 351. STARR AND ZAPATA COUNTIES</u>
- 8 SUBCHAPTER A. FALCON LAKE
- 9 Sec. 351.001. COMMERCIAL CATFISH FISHING. (a)
- 10 Notwithstanding any other law and except as provided by Subsection
- 11 (b), a person may engage in commercial catfish fishing in the
- 12 portion of Falcon Lake in this state that borders Starr and Zapata
- 13 Counties if the person:
- 14 (1) holds the required commercial fishing license
- 15 issued by the department; and
- 16 (2) engages in the commercial fishing on a vessel
- 17 licensed as a commercial fishing boat by the department.
- 18 (b) The department may regulate the amount of catfish taken
- 19 from the portion of Falcon Lake described by Subsection (a) if the
- 20 department determines that regulation is necessary to protect the
- 21 catfish population in Falcon Lake from depletion or waste.
- 22 <u>(c) The commission may adopt rules related to commercial</u>
- 23 <u>catfish fishing in Falcon Lake.</u>
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
