A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 relating to the annual salaries of the chief justice or the

- 3 presiding judge of an appellate court.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 659.012(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Notwithstanding Section 659.011:
- 8 (1) a judge of a district court is entitled to an
- 9 annual salary from the state of at least \$125,000, except that the
- 10 combined salary of a district judge from state and county sources,
- 11 including compensation for any extrajudicial services performed on
- 12 behalf of the county, may not exceed the amount that is \$5,000 less
- 13 than the salary provided for a justice of a court of appeals other
- 14 than a chief justice;
- 15 (2) a justice of a court of appeals other than the
- 16 chief justice is entitled to an annual salary from the state that is
- 17 equal to 110 percent of the salary of a district judge, except that
- 18 the combined salary of a justice of the court of appeals other than
- 19 the chief justice from all state and county sources, including
- 20 compensation for any extrajudicial services performed on behalf of
- 21 the county, may not exceed the amount that is \$5,000 less than the
- 22 salary provided for a justice of the supreme court;
- 23 (3) a justice of the supreme court other than the chief
- 24 justice or a judge of the court of criminal appeals other than the

- 1 presiding judge is entitled to an annual salary from the state that
- 2 is equal to 120 percent of the salary of a district judge; [and]
- 3 (4) the chief justice [or presiding judge] of <u>a court</u>
- 4 of appeals [an appellate court] is entitled to an annual salary from
- 5 the state that is $$5,000 \ [\$2,500]$ more than the salary provided for
- 6 the other justices or judges of the court, except that the combined
- 7 salary of the chief justice of a court of appeals may not exceed the
- 8 [amount that is \$2,500 less than the] salary provided for a justice
- 9 of the supreme court; and
- 10 (5) the chief justice of the supreme court or the
- 11 presiding judge of the court of criminal appeals is entitled to an
- 12 annual salary from the state that is \$10,000 more than the salary
- 13 provided for the other justices or judges of the court.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
