4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Glenda Dawson Act.
6	SECTION 2. The state finds that the treatment of chronic
7	kidney disease is a tremendous expense and that the early diagnosis
8	and effective treatment of chronic kidney disease can prolong lives
9	and delay the high cost of medical treatment, including dialysis
10	and transplantation.
11	SECTION 3. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
12	amended by adding Chapter 83 to read as follows:
13	CHAPTER 83. CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE TASK FORCE
14	Sec. 83.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "task force"
15	means the Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force.
16	Sec. 83.002. CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE TASK FORCE. (a) The
17	Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force is composed of:
18	(1) 20 members appointed by the governor as follows:
19	(A) one family practice physician;
20	(B) one pathologist;
21	(C) one nephrologist from a nephrology
22	department of a state medical school;
23	(D) one nephrologist in private practice;
24	(E) one representative from the National Kidney

- 6 regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or
- 7 <u>national origin of the appointees.</u>
- 8 Sec. 83.003. DUTIES. The task force shall:
- 9 (1) coordinate implementation of the state's
- 10 cost-effective plan for prevention, early screening, diagnosis,
- 11 and management of chronic kidney disease for the state's population
- 12 through national, state, and local partners; and
- 13 (2) educate health care professionals on the use of
- 14 clinical practice guidelines for screening, detecting, diagnosing,
- 15 treating, and managing chronic kidney disease, its comorbidities,
- 16 and its complications based on the Kidney Disease Outcomes Quality
- 17 Initiative Clinical Practice Guidelines for Chronic Kidney
- 18 Disease.
- 19 Sec. 83.004. REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the task force may
- 20 receive reimbursement for travel expenses as provided by Section
- 21 2110.004, Government Code.
- Sec. 83.005. ASSISTANCE. The commission shall provide
- 23 administrative support to the task force, including necessary staff
- 24 and meeting facilities.
- Sec. 83.006. REPORT. Not later than January 1 of each
- 26 odd-numbered year, the task force shall submit its findings and
- 27 recommendations to:

- 1 (1) the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of
- 2 the house of representatives; and
- 3 (2) the presiding officers of the appropriate standing
- 4 committees of the legislature with jurisdiction over health issues.
- 5 Sec. 83.007. FUNDING. (a) The task force, through the
- 6 commission, may accept gifts and grants from individuals, private
- 7 or public organizations, or federal or local funds to support the
- 8 task force.
- 9 <u>(b) The commission shall investigate any potential sources</u>
- 10 of funding from federal grants or programs.
- 11 Sec. 83.008. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Except as
- 12 specifically provided by this chapter, Chapter 2110, Government
- 13 Code, does not apply to the task force.
- 14 Sec. 83.009. TASK FORCE REVIEW AND ABOLISHMENT. (a) The
- 15 commission shall review the continued need for the task force at
- 16 <u>least once every five years.</u>
- 17 (b) If the commission determines the task force is no longer
- 18 needed and should be abolished, the commission shall publish notice
- 19 of its decision in the Texas Register and on the commission's
- 20 Internet website.
- 21 <u>(c)</u> The task force is abolished on the date stated in the
- 22 notice required by Subsection (b).
- SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2020, the governor,
- 24 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives
- 25 shall appoint the members to the Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force
- 26 as required by Section 83.002, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 27 this Act.
