7	Sec. 161.00708. ACCESS TO FIRST RESPONDER IMMUNIZATION
8	HISTORY. (a) The department shall establish a process to provide
9	an employer of a first responder with direct access to the first
10	responder's immunization information in the immunization registry
11	for verification of the first responder's immunization history.
12	The process must require a first responder to provide electronic or
13	written consent before the employer is granted direct access to the
14	first responder's immunization information in the immunization
15	registry. A first responder may withdraw consent at any time.
16	(b) The department may establish a process to provide a
17	first responder with access to the first responder's immunization
18	information in the immunization registry.
19	SECTION 2. Section 161.008(d), Health and Safety Code, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(d) The department may release the data constituting an
22	immunization record for the individual to:
23	(1) any entity that is described by Subsection (c);

- 6 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2020, the executive
