## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

_	AN ACT

- 2 relating to requiring the operator of a vehicle to stop and yield
- 3 the right-of-way to a pedestrian.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 552.002(b), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A pedestrian facing a "Walk" signal may proceed across a
- 8 roadway in the direction of the signal, and the operator of a
- 9 vehicle shall stop and yield the right-of-way to the pedestrian.
- SECTION 2. Sections 552.003(a) and (b), Transportation
- 11 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) The operator of a vehicle shall stop and yield the
- 13 right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing a roadway in a crosswalk if:
- 14 (1) no traffic control signal is in place or in
- 15 operation; and
- 16 (2) the pedestrian is:
- 17 (A) on the half of the roadway in which the
- 18 vehicle is traveling; or
- 19 (B) approaching so closely from the opposite half
- 20 of the roadway as to be in danger.
- 21 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a pedestrian may not
- 22 suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and proceed into a
- 23 crosswalk in the path of a vehicle so close that it is impossible
- 24 for the vehicle operator to stop and yield.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 552.006(c), Transportation Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (c) The operator of a vehicle emerging from or entering an
- 4 alley, building, or private road or driveway shall stop and yield
- 5 the right-of-way to a pedestrian approaching on a sidewalk
- 6 extending across the alley, building entrance or exit, road, or
- 7 driveway.
- 8 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 11 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 12 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 13 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 14 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was
- 15 committed before that date.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
