11	and attorney at the time of the attorney's appointment if:
12	(1) the court and attorney enter into a written
13	compensation agreement; and
14	(2) the amount of the attorney's compensation is not
15	otherwise established by law.
16	(b) A court may pay a court-appointed attorney an amount
17	less than the amount described by Subsection (a) if the court finds
18	that the attorney:
19	(1) breached the attorney's duties by performing in an
20	unreasonable manner the services for which the court appointed the
21	attorney; or
22	(2) failed to perform the services for which the court

appointed the attorney.

- 7 (3) the municipality if the court is a municipal court
- 8 or municipal court of record of the municipality.
- 9 Sec. 85.003. WAIVER OF IMMUNITY. Sovereign or governmental
- 10 immunity to suit and liability is waived and abolished to the extent
- of liability created under Section 85.002.
