3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 1.07(a), Tax Code, is amended to read as
5	follows:
6	(a) An official or agency required by this title to deliver
7	a notice to a property owner may deliver the notice by regular
8	first-class mail, with postage prepaid, unless this section or
9	another provision of this title requires or authorizes a different
10	method of delivery or the parties agree that the notice must be
11	delivered as provided by Section 1.085 or 1.086.
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 1, Tax Code, is amended by adding Section
13	1.086 to read as follows:
14	Sec. 1.086. DELIVERY OF CERTAIN NOTICES BY E-MAIL. (a) On
15	the written request of the owner of a residential property that is
16	occupied by the owner as the owner's principal residence, the chief
17	appraiser of the appraisal district in which the property is
18	located shall send each notice required by this title related to the
19	following to the e-mail address of the owner:
20	(1) a change in value of the property;
21	(2) the eligibility of the property for an exemption;
22	or
23	(3) the grant, denial, cancellation, or other change
24	in the status of an exemption or exemption application applicable

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1	to	the	property.	
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2 (b) A property owner must provide the e-mail address to 3 which the chief appraiser must send the notices described by 4 Subsection (a) in a request made under that subsection.

5 <u>(c) A chief appraiser who delivers a notice electronically</u> 6 <u>under this section is not required to mail the same notice to the</u> 7 <u>property owner.</u>

8 (d) A request made under this section remains in effect 9 until revoked by the property owner in a written revocation filed 10 with the chief appraiser.

11 (e) After a property owner makes a request under this 12 section and before a chief appraiser may deliver a notice 13 electronically under this section, the chief appraiser must send an 14 e-mail to the address provided by the property owner confirming the 15 owner's request to receive notices electronically.

16 (f) The chief appraiser of an appraisal district that 17 maintains an Internet website shall provide a form on the website 18 that a property owner may use to electronically make a request under 19 this section.

20 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 6, Tax Code, is amended by 21 adding Section 6.054 to read as follows:

22 <u>Sec. 6.054. RESTRICTION ON EMPLOYMENT BY APPRAISAL</u> 23 <u>DISTRICT. An individual may not be employed by an appraisal</u> 24 <u>district if the individual is:</u>

25 (1) an officer of a taxing unit that participates in 26 the appraisal district; or

27 (2) an employee of a taxing unit that participates in

1	the appraisal district.
2	SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 6, Tax Code, is amended by
3	adding Section 6.16 to read as follows:
4	Sec. 6.16. RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY OWNER ASSISTANCE. (a) The
5	chief appraiser of each appraisal district shall maintain a list of
6	the following individuals who have designated themselves as an
7	individual who will provide free assistance to an owner of
8	residential property that is occupied by the owner as the owner's
9	principal residence:
10	(1) a real estate broker or sales agent licensed under
11	Chapter 1101, Occupations Code;
12	(2) a real estate appraiser licensed or certified
13	under Chapter 1103, Occupations Code; or
14	(3) a property tax consultant registered under Chapter
15	1152, Occupations Code.
16	(b) On the request of an owner described by Subsection (a),
17	the chief appraiser shall provide to the owner a copy of the list
18	maintained under this section.
19	(c) The list must:
20	(1) be organized by county;
21	(2) be available on the appraisal district's Internet
22	website, if the appraisal district maintains a website; and
23	(3) provide the name, contact information, and job
24	title of each individual who will provide free assistance.
25	(d) A person must designate himself or herself as an
26	individual who will provide free assistance by completing a form
27	prescribed by the chief appraiser and submitting the form to the

1 <u>chief appraiser.</u>

2 SECTION 5. Chapter 25, Tax Code, is amended by adding 3 Sections 25.192 and 25.193 to read as follows:

<u>Sec. 25.192. NOTICE OF RESIDENCE HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION</u>
<u>ELIGIBILITY.</u> (a) This section applies only to residential
property that has not qualified for a residence homestead exemption
<u>in the current tax year.</u>

8 (b) If the records of the appraisal district indicate that 9 the address of the property is also the address of the owner of the 10 property, the chief appraiser must send to the property owner a 11 notice that contains:

12 (1) the following statement in boldfaced 18-point type 13 at the top of the first page of the notice: "NOTICE: A residence 14 homestead exemption from ad valorem taxation is NOT currently being 15 allowed on the property listed below. However, our records show 16 that this property may qualify for a residence homestead exemption, 17 which will reduce your taxes.";

(2) following the statement described by Subdivision 18 19 (1), the following statement in 12-point type: "According to the records of the appraisal district, the property described in this 20 notice may be your primary residence and may qualify for a residence 21 homestead exemption from ad valorem taxation. If the property is 22 your home and you occupy it as your primary residence, the property 23 24 likely qualifies for one or more residence homestead exemptions, which will reduce the amount of taxes imposed on the property. The 25 26 form needed to apply for a residence homestead exemption is enclosed. Although the form may state that the deadline for filing 27

an application for a residence homestead exemption is April 30, a 1 late application for a residence homestead exemption will be 2 accepted if filed before February 1, (insert year application must 3 be filed). There is no fee or charge for filing an application or a 4 5 late application for a residence homestead exemption."; and 6 (3) following the statement described by Subdivision 7 (2), the address to which the notice is sent. 8 (c) The notice required by this section must be accompanied by an application form for a residence homestead exemption. 9 10 (d) If a property owner has elected to receive notices by e-mail as provided by Section 1.086, the notice required by this 11 12 section must be sent in that manner separately from any other notice sent to the property owner by the chief appraiser. 13 Sec. 25.193. NOTICE OF CERTAIN CANCELED OR REDUCED 14 15 EXEMPTIONS. (a) By April 1 or as soon thereafter as practicable if the property is a single-family residence that qualifies for an 16 17 exemption under Section 11.13, or by May 1 or as soon thereafter as practicable in connection with residential property that does not 18 19 qualify for an exemption under Section 11.13, the chief appraiser shall deliver a clear and understandable written notice to a 20 property owner if an exemption or partial exemption that was 21 22 approved for the preceding year was canceled or reduced for the 23 current year. 24 (b) If a property owner has elected to receive notices by e-mail as provided by Section 1.086, for property described by that 25

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26 section, the notice required by this section must be sent in that 27 manner regardless of whether the information was also included in a

notice under Section 25.19 and must be sent separately from any other notice sent to the property owner by the chief appraiser.

3 SECTION 6. Section 25.19(b-2), Tax Code, is repealed.

SECTION 7. Section 25.19, Tax Code, as amended by this Act, and Sections 25.192 and 25.193, Tax Code, as added by this Act, apply only to a notice for a tax year beginning on or after the reffective date of this Act. A notice for a tax year beginning before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 8. This Act takes effect January 1, 2020.
