- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6
- SECTION 1. COMMISSION TO STUDY CERTAIN LAWS THAT RESTRICT 7
- RIGHTS OR ACTIVITIES OF PERSONS CONVICTED OF FELONY OFFENSES. 8
- (a) A commission is created to study and review all laws of this 9
- state that restrict the rights or activities of persons convicted 10
- of a felony offense, including: 11
- 12 (1) the right to vote;
- 13 the right to serve on a grand or petit jury; and (2)
- 14 (3) eligibility for certain occupational licenses.
- The commission shall: 15 (b)
- evaluate all laws described by Subsection (a) of 16
- this section; and 17
- 18 (2) make recommendations to the legislature regarding
- the repeal or amendment of laws that are identified as being overly 19
- 20 restrictive or not otherwise serving the best interest of justice.
- 21 The commission is composed of nine members appointed as

- 1 (3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house

- 3 (4) one member appointed by the chief justice of the

- 5 (5) two members appointed by the presiding judge of

- 7 (d) The officials making appointments to the commission
- 8 under Subsection (c) of this section shall ensure that the
- 9 membership of the commission includes judges, legal scholars, and
- 10 relevant business and governmental interests.
- 11 (e) The governor shall designate one member of the
- 12 commission to serve as the presiding officer of the commission.
- 13 (f) A member of the commission is not entitled to
- 14 compensation or reimbursement of expenses.
- 15 (g) The commission shall meet at the call of the presiding
- 16 officer.
- (h) Not later than November 1, 2020, the commission shall
- 18 report the commission's findings and recommendations to the
- 19 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 20 representatives, the Supreme Court of Texas, and the Texas Court of
- 21 Criminal Appeals. The commission shall include in its
- 22 recommendations any specific statutes that the commission

- 24 SECTION 2. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS. Not later than the 60th
- 25 day after the effective date of this Act, the governor, the
- 26 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 27 the chief justice of the Supreme Court of Texas, and the presiding

- 1 judge of the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals shall appoint the
- 2 members of the commission created under this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. ABOLITION OF COMMISSION. The commission is
- 4 abolished and this Act expires December 31, 2020.
- 5 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 6 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 7 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 8 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 9 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
