1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to cybersecurity of voter registration lists and other
 1-22 election-related documents, systems, and technology.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Title 16, Election Code, is amended by adding
 1-25 Chapter 279 to read as follows:

1-26 CHAPTER 279. CYBERSECURITY OF ELECTION SYSTEMS

1-27 Sec. 279.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

1-28 (1) "County election officer" means an individual
 1-29 employed by a county as an elections administrator, voter
 1-30 registrar, county clerk, or other officer with responsibilities
 1-31 relating to the administration of elections.

1-32 (2) "Election data" means information that is created
 1-33 or managed in the operation of an election system.

1-34 (3) "Election system" means a voting system and the
 1-35 technology used to support the conduct of an election, including
 1-36 the election data processed or produced in the course of conducting
 1-37 an election, such as voter registration information, ballot
 1-38 information, collected and tabulated votes, election management
 1-39 processes and procedures, and other election-related documents and
 1-40 election data.

1-41 Sec. 279.002. ELECTION CYBERSECURITY: SECRETARY OF STATE.

1-42 (a) The secretary of state shall adopt rules defining classes of
 1-43 protected election data and establishing best practices for
 1-44 identifying and reducing risk to the electronic use, storage, and
 1-45 transmission of election data and the security of election systems.

1-46 (b) The secretary of state shall offer training on best
 1-47 practices:

1-48 (1) on an annual basis, to all appropriate personnel
 1-49 in the secretary of state's office; and

1-50 (2) on request, to county election officers in this
 1-51 state.

1-52 (c) If the secretary of state becomes aware of a breach of
 1-53 cybersecurity that impacts election data, the secretary shall
 1-54 immediately notify the members of the standing committees of each
 1-55 house of the legislature with jurisdiction over elections.

1-56 Sec. 279.003. ELECTION CYBERSECURITY: COUNTY ELECTION

1-57 OFFICERS. (a) A county election officer shall annually request
 1-58 training on cybersecurity from the secretary of state. The
 1-59 secretary of state shall pay the costs associated with the training
 1-60 with available state funds.
