9	by that chapter, the commission is abolished and this chapter
10	expires September 1, <u>2031</u> [2019].
11	SECTION 2. Section 442.0021, Government Code, is amended by
12	amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
13	follows:
14	(b) The training program must provide the person with
15	information regarding:
16	(1) the <u>law governing</u> [legislation that created the]
17	commission <u>operations</u> ;
18	(2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the
19	commission;
20	(3) the scope of and limitations on the rulemaking
21	authority of the commission;
22	(4) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
23	commission;
24	(5) [(4)] the requirements of <u>:</u>

1 <u>(A)</u> laws relating to open meetings, public 2 information, administrative procedure, and <u>disclosing</u> conflicts of 3 interest; and

4 (B) other laws applicable to members of the 5 commission in performing their duties; and

6 (6) [(5)] any applicable ethics policies adopted by
7 the commission or the Texas Ethics Commission.

8 (d) The executive director of the commission shall create a 9 training manual that includes the information required by 10 Subsection (b). The executive director shall distribute a copy of 11 the training manual annually to each member of the commission. Each 12 member of the commission shall sign and submit to the executive 13 director a statement acknowledging that the member received and has 14 reviewed the training manual.

15 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 442, Government Code, is 16 amended by adding Sections 442.0045 and 442.0088 to read as 17 follows:

No. 1422 1 preservation trust fund account grants, and all other grants; 2 (15) selecting the winners of the governor's award for historic preservation and other competitive statewide awards 3 awarded by the commission; 4 5 (16) approving curatorial facilities to hold state-associated collections that are held in trust; 6 7 (17) acquiring and disposing of real property; 8 (18) establishing fees for commission services; 9 (19) approving amendments to contracts entered into by 10 the commission if the amendment extends the contract by six or more months or increases the contract price by 10 percent or more; 11 12 (20) identifying and defining the relationship between the commission and any affiliated nonprofit organization; 13 14 (21) raising issues regarding the performance of the 15 commission's staff and the operation of agency programs with the chair, the executive director, or the appropriate deputy executive 16 17 director; (22) determining whether a property offered to the 18 19 commission should be accepted into the commission's land banking program or as a historic site; and 20 21 (23) recommending, in partnership with the Texas State 22 Historical Association, a nominee for appointment by the governor 23 as state historian. 24 (c) A delegation under this section may be amended or 25 withdrawn by commission vote. 26 Sec. 442.0088. TEXAS HERITAGE TRAILS PROGRAM. (a) The 27 Texas Historical Commission may establish and administer the Texas

No. 1422 1 Heritage Trails Program to promote tourism to heritage and cultural 2 attractions in this state. 3 (b) The commission may contract with one or more nonprofit organizations to fulfill the commission's duties under this 4 5 section. (c) The commission shall adopt rules to administer the Texas 6 7 Heritage Trails Program, including rules defining the principles of 8 heritage tourism and relating to contracts the commission enters into with nonprofit organizations. Rules adopted under this 9 10 subsection relating to contracts with nonprofit organizations must require each contract to clearly establish: 11 12 (1) the role of the nonprofit organization in 13 promoting heritage tourism; 14 (2) the nature of the relationship between the 15 commission and the nonprofit organization; 16 (3) the performance expectations for the nonprofit 17 organization; (4) requirements and expectations regarding 18 the 19 nonprofit organization's employees; (5) the commission's expectations regarding ownership 20 of any literature, media, or other products developed or produced 21 22 by the nonprofit organization to promote heritage tourism during the course of the contract; 23 24 (6) the commission's long-term goals for the program and the nonprofit organization's role in meeting those goals; 25 26 (7) a system for evaluating the nonprofit organization's overall performance, including the organization's 27

effectiveness in meeting the performance expectations described by 1 Subdivision (3); and 2 3 (8) the types of support, other than financial support, the commission will provide to the nonprofit organization 4 5 to assist in the implementation and administration of the Texas Heritage Trails Program. 6 7 SECTION 4. 22	proportionality requirement.
23	SECTION 6. Chapter 442, Government Code, is amended by

7 (b) The San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Site is a
8 historic site for purposes of Subchapter C.

JACINTO MUSEUM 9 Sec. 442.252 [22.016]. SAN OF HISTORY 10 ASSOCIATION. The San Jacinto Museum of History Association, a nonprofit historical association organized for the purposes of 11 12 operating the San Jacinto Memorial Building and Tower and establishing a museum, retains ownership of property and historical 13 14 data held in the name of the association and may acquire museum 15 accessions by gift, grant, or purchase from association funds.

16 SECTION 8. Subchapter H, Chapter 22, Parks and Wildlife 17 Code, is transferred to Chapter 442, Government Code, redesignated 18 as Subchapter G, Chapter 442, Government Code, and amended to read 19 as follows:

20 SUBCHAPTER <u>G</u> [H]. PORT ISABEL LIGHTHOUSE STATE HISTORICAL MONUMENT 21 AND PARK

22 Sec. <u>442.271</u> [<u>22.101</u>]. JURISDICTION. <u>(a)</u> The Port Isabel 23 Lighthouse is a state historical monument and park and is under the 24 jurisdiction of the <u>commission</u> [department].

(b) The Port Isabel Lighthouse State Historical Monument
 and Park is a historic site for purposes of Subchapter C.

27 Sec. <u>442.272</u> [22.102]. POWERS OF <u>COMMISSION</u> [DEPARTMENT].

1 The <u>commission</u> [department] may rehabilitate, maintain, and 2 preserve the property of the park, and may collect entrance fees for 3 admission to the park or operate it on a concession basis under the 4 provisions of this chapter [code].

5 SECTION 9. Subchapter Z, Chapter 2175, Government Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 2175.909 to read as follows:

Sec. 2175.909. SALE OF CERTAIN HISTORIC PROPERTY; PROCEEDS
 OF SALE. (a) In this section, "qualifying collection" means an
 archeological, architectural, archival, decorative, or fine arts
 collection.

11 (b) This section applies only to a state agency:

that maintains a qualifying collection;

12

13 (2) that is authorized to dispose of surplus or 14 salvage property under Section 2175.065; and

15 (3) the governing body of which has adopted a written 16 policy governing the care and preservation of the qualifying 17 collection, including procedures relating to the deaccession of an 18 item from the collection.

19 <u>(c) The state agency may deaccession an item from the</u> 20 <u>agency's qualifying collection if the governing body determines</u> 21 <u>that deaccession of the item is appropriate under the agency's</u> 22 <u>written policy governing the care and preservation of the</u> 23 <u>collection.</u>

24 (d) A state agency and the Texas Facilities Commission may
 25 sell a deaccessioned item in the manner provided by Subchapter D.
 26 Before the sale of the item, the Texas Facilities Commission must
 27 verify that the state agency's governing body complied with

1 <u>Subsection (c).</u>

2 (e) Notwithstanding Section 2175.191, proceeds from the 3 sale of the deaccessioned item by a state agency shall be deposited 4 to the credit of a dedicated account in the general revenue fund in 5 the manner prescribed by Subsection (f).

6 (f) The comptroller shall separately account for the amount 7 of money deposited to the credit of the account under Subsection (e) 8 resulting from the sale of deaccessioned items by each state 9 agency. Money deposited to the credit of the account may be 10 appropriated only to the state agency for which the comptroller 11 deposited the money to the account for the care and preservation of 12 the agency's qualifying collection.

13 SECTION 10. Section 21.104, Parks and Wildlife Code, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 Sec. 21.104. CONTRACTS AUTHORIZED. The department may 16 contract with any state or federal agency or with any other person 17 to accomplish the functions prescribed by <u>Sections 21.102(1) and</u> 18 (2) [Subdivisions (1) and (2) of Section 22.102 of this code].

19 SECTION 11. Section 151.801(c), Tax Code, is amended to 20 read as follows:

(c) The proceeds from the collection of the taxes imposed by this chapter on the sale, storage, or use of sporting goods shall be deposited as follows:

(1) an amount equal to <u>93</u> [94] percent of the proceeds
shall be credited to the Parks and Wildlife Department <u>for the</u>
<u>purposes described by Subsection (c-1)</u> and deposited <u>to department</u>
accounts as provided by that subsection [specified in the Parks and

1 Wildlife Code]; and 2 an amount equal to seven [six] percent of the (2) proceeds shall be credited to the Texas Historical Commission and 3 deposited to the credit of the historic site account under [as 4 5 specified in] Section 442.073, Government Code. SECTION 12. The following provisions are repealed: 6 7 Section 442.0081(g), Government Code; (1) Sections 442.015(d), (e), and (f), Government 8 (2) 9 Code; 10 (3) Subchapter A, Chapter 22, Parks and Wildlife Code; the heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 22, Parks and 11 (4) 12 Wildlife Code; and (5) Sections 22.012, 22.013, 22.014, and 22.015, Parks 13 14 and Wildlife Code. 15 SECTION 13. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this section, Section 442.0021, Government Code, as amended by this 16 17 Act, applies to a member of the Texas Historical Commission appointed before, on, or after the effective date of this Act. 18 19 (b) A member of the Texas Historical Commission who, before the effective date of this Act, completed the training program 20 required by Section 442.0021, Government Code, as that law existed 21 before the effective date of this Act, is required to complete 22 additional training only on subjects added by this Act to the 23 24 training program as required by Section 442.0021, Government Code, as amended by this Act. A commission member described by this 25 26 subsection may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a meeting of the commission held on or after December 27

1 1, 2019, until the member completes the additional training.

SECTION 14. (a) Not later than November 1, 2019, the Texas
Historical Commission shall adopt rules under Section 442.0088,
Government Code, as added by this Act.

5 (b) Section 442.0088(c), Government Code, as added by this 6 Act, applies only to a contract relating to the Texas Heritage 7 Trails Program that is entered into by the Texas Historical 8 Commission and a nonprofit organization on or after the effective 9 date of this Act.

10 SECTION 15. Section 2175.909, Government Code, as added by 11 this Act, applies only to the deaccession of an item from a state 12 agency's qualifying collection, as that term is defined by Section 13 2175.909, that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 16. (a) In this section, "historic site" means the:
(1) Fanthorp Inn State Historic Site;

(2) Lipantitlan State Historic Site;

17 (3) Monument Hill and Kreische Brewery State Historic18 Sites;

19 (4) Port Isabel Lighthouse State Historical Monument20 and Park;

(5) San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Site; and

22 (6) Washington-on-the-Brazos State Historic Site.

(b) On September 1, 2019, the following are transferred tothe Texas Historical Commission:

(1) each historic site described by Subsection (a) of
this section and all obligations and liabilities of the Parks and
Wildlife Department relating to those sites;

1 (2) all unobligated and unexpended funds appropriated 2 to the Parks and Wildlife Department designated for the 3 administration of those sites;

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4 (3) all equipment and property of the Parks and 5 Wildlife Department used for the administration of or related to 6 those sites; and

7 (4) all files and other records of the Parks and8 Wildlife Department kept by the department regarding those sites.

9 (c) A rule adopted by the Parks and Wildlife Commission that 10 is in effect immediately before September 1, 2019, and that relates 11 to a historic site is, on September 1, 2019, a rule of the Texas 12 Historical Commission and remains in effect until amended or 13 repealed by the Texas Historical Commission.

(d) The transfer under this section does not diminish or impair the rights of a holder of an outstanding bond or other obligation issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department in relation to the support of a historic site.

Beginning September 1, 2019, a reference in the Parks 18 (e) and Wildlife Code or other law to a power, duty, obligation, or 19 liability of the Parks and Wildlife Department or the Parks and 20 Wildlife Commission that relates to a historic site is a reference 21 22 to the Texas Historical Commission. The Texas Historical Commission is the successor agency to the Parks and Wildlife 23 24 Department and the Parks and Wildlife Commission for a historic 25 site.

26 (f) Before September 1, 2019, the Parks and Wildlife 27 Department may agree with the Texas Historical Commission to

1 transfer any property of the Parks and Wildlife Department to the 2 Texas Historical Commission to implement the transfer required by 3 this section.

(g) Until a historic site is transferred to the Texas
Historical Commission in accordance with this section, the Parks
and Wildlife Department shall continue to operate and maintain the
site under applicable law as it existed on January 1, 2018.

8 (h) This section takes effect immediately if this Act 9 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 10 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 11 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 12 effect, this section takes effect on the 91st day after the last day 13 of the legislative session.

14 SECTION 17. Notwithstanding any other provision of this 15 Act, if on or before September 1, 2019, the Parks and Wildlife 16 Department has applied for a grant for which the department is 17 required to possess legal title to the San Jacinto Battleground 18 State Historic Site, the department may retain legal title to the 19 site for purposes of receiving the grant until the earlier of:

20 (1) the date on which the grant application is denied;21 or

22

(2) September 1, 2021.

23 SECTION 18. The Texas Historical Commission is required to 24 implement a provision of this Act only if the legislature 25 appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If the 26 legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that 27 purpose, the commission may, but is not required to, implement a

1 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that
2 purpose.

3 SECTION 19. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, this4 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
