## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:										
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is										
6	amended by adding Chapter 113 to read as follows:										
7	CHAPTER 113. TEXAS MENTAL HEALTH CARE CONSORTIUM										
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS										
9	Sec. 113.0001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:										
10	(1) "Community mental health provider" means an entity										
11	that provides mental health care services at a local level. The										
12	term includes community centers established under Subchapter A,										
13	Chapter 534.										
14	(2) "Consortium" means the Texas Mental Health Care										
15	Consortium.										
16	(3) "Executive committee" means the executive										
17	committee of the consortium.										
18	SUBCHAPTER B. CONSORTIUM										
19	Sec. 113.0051. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSE. The Texas Mental										
20	Health Care Consortium is established to:										
21	(1) leverage the expertise and capacity in the										
22	health-related institutions of higher education listed in Section										
23	113.0052 to address urgent mental health challenges and improve the										
24	mental health care system in this state;										

1	(2) enhance the state's ability to address mental								
2	health care needs through stronger collaboration and institutional								
3	alignment of the health-related institutions of higher education								
4	listed in Section 113.0052;								
5	(3) improve the effectiveness and efficiency of mental								
6	health care services delivered in this state;								
7	(4) facilitate access to mental health care services								
8	through telemedicine and other cost-effective, evidence-based								
9	programs;								
10	(5) improve mental health and substance use disorder								
11	research efforts conducted by institutions of higher education; and								
12	(6) improve and expand the behavioral health workforce								
13	through training and development opportunities between the								
14	health-related institutions of higher education listed in Section								
15	113.0052 and community mental health providers.								
16	Sec. 113.0052. COMPOSITION. The consortium is composed of:								
17	(1) the following health-related institutions of								
18	higher education:								
19	(A) Baylor College of Medicine;

- 3 SUBCHAPTER C. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE
- 4 Sec. 113.0101. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE COMPOSITION. The
- 5 consortium is governed by an executive committee composed of the
- 6 following members:
- 7 (1) the chair of the academic department of psychiatry
- 8 of each of the health-related institutions of higher education
- 9 listed in Section 113.0052;
- 10 (2) a representative of the commission with expertise
- 11 in the delivery of mental health care services, appointed by the
- 12 executive commissioner;
- 13 (3) a representative of the commission with expertise
- 14 in mental health facilities, appointed by the executive
- 15 commissioner;
- 16 <u>(4) a representative of an organization</u> that
- 17 represents the interests of community centers established under
- 18 Subchapter A, Chapter 534, designated by a majority of the members
- 19 described by Subdivision (1);
- 20 (5) a representative of each nonprofit organization
- 21 described by Section 113.0052 that is part of the consortium,
- 22 designated by a majority of the members described by Subdivision
- 23 <u>(1); and</u>
- 24 (6) any other representative designated by a majority
- 25 of the members described by Subdivision (1) at the request of the
- 26 executive committee.
- Sec. 113.0102. PRESIDING OFFICER. The executive committee

- 1 shall elect a presiding officer from among the membership of the
- 2 executive committee.
- 3 Sec. 113.0103. MEETINGS. The executive committee shall
- 4 meet at the call of the presiding officer.
- 5 Sec. 113.0104. VACANCY. A vacancy on the executive
- 6 committee shall be filled in the same manner as the original
- 7 <u>appointment.</u>
- 8 Sec. 113.0105. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The executive
- 9 committee may accept on behalf of the consortium gifts, grants, or
- 10 donations from any public or private source for the purpose of
- 11 carrying out this chapter.
- 12 SUBCHAPTER D. POWERS AND DUTIES
- Sec. 113.0151. GENERAL DUTIES. (a) The executive
- 14 committee shall:
- 15 (1) coordinate the provision of grants or other
- 16 funding to the health-related institutions of higher education
- 17 listed in Section 113.0052 to carry out the purposes of this
- 18 chapter;
- 19 (2) establish procedures and policies for the
- 20 administration of funds under this chapter;
- 21 (3) monitor contracts and other agreements entered
- 22 <u>into under this chapter to ensure recipients of grants or other</u>
- 23 funding comply with the terms and conditions of those contracts or
- 24 agreements; and
- 25 (4) establish procedures to document compliance by
- 26 executive committee members and staff with applicable laws
- 27 governing conflicts of interest.

- 1 (b) In carrying out the duties under Subsection (a), the
- 2 consortium shall ensure that evidence-based tools, including
- 3 telemedicine, are used to help expand the delivery of mental health
- 4 care services.
- 5 (c) The consortium shall designate a member of the executive
- 6 committee to work in liaison with the statewide behavioral health
- 7 coordinating council.
- 8 Sec. 113.0152. COMPREHENSIVE CHILD PSYCHIATRY ACCESS
- 9 CENTERS. (a) The consortium shall establish a network of
- 10 comprehensive child psychiatry access centers at the
- 11 health-related institutions of higher education listed in Section
- 12 113.0052.
- 13 (b) A center established under Subsection (a) shall
- 14 collaborate with community mental health providers to better care
- 15 for children and youth with behavioral health needs by:
- 16 (1) providing consultation services and training
- 17 opportunities for pediatricians and primary care providers
- 18 operating in the center's geographic region; and
- 19 (2) establishing or expanding a telemedicine or
- 20 telehealth program for identifying and assessing behavioral health
- 21 needs and providing access to mental health care services.
- (c) A center established under Subsection (a) may enter into
- 23 a memorandum of understanding with a community mental health
- 24 provider to carry out this section.
- Sec. 113.0153. MENTAL HEALTH RESEARCH PLAN. The consortium
- 26 shall:
- 27 (1) develop and implement a mental health research

- 1 plan to advance the research component of the statewide behavioral
- 2 health strategic plan;
- 3 (2) create an aggregated inventory of mental health
- 4 and substance use disorder research completed by institutions of
- 5 higher education in this state; and
- 6 (3) coordinate mental health and substance use
- 7 disorder research efforts by the health-related institutions of
- 8 higher education listed in Section 113.0052 to ensure those
- 9 institutions engage in effective and targeted research to leverage
- 10 additional funding.
- 11 Sec. 113.0154. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH WORKFORCE EXPANSION
- 12 PROJECT. (a) The consortium shall enhance collaboration between
- 13 the health-related institutions of higher education listed in
- 14 Section 113.0052 and community mental health providers to increase
- 15 psychiatric residency training and improve the quality of care for
- 16 persons receiving mental health care services in this state.
- 17 (b) The executive committee may provide grants or other
- 18 funding to the academic department of psychiatry at a
- 19 health-related institution of higher education listed in Section
- 20 113.0052 for the purpose of funding:
- 21 (1) one full-time psychiatrist to serve as academic
- 22 medical director for a community mental health provider; and
- 23 (2) two resident positions.
- (c) An academic medical director described by Subsection
- 25 (b) shall collaborate and coordinate with community mental health
- 26 providers to expand the amount and availability of mental health
- 27 care resources by:

- 1 (1) developing training opportunities for residents
- 2 and medical students; and
- 3 (2) promoting the use of telemedicine or other
- 4 evidence-based tools to provide comprehensive mental health care
- 5 services to a greater population.
- 6 (d) An institution of higher education that receives grants
- 7 or other funding under Subsection (b) shall include in its
- 8 curriculum a requirement that psychiatric residents and medical
- 9 students participate in rotations through a facility operated by
- 10 community mental health providers.
- Sec. 113.0155. REIMBURSEMENT FOR SERVICES. A person may
- 12 not be reimbursed by the consortium for providing mental health
- 13 care services under this chapter if the person is reimbursed under
- 14 Medicaid or another program operated by the commission for
- 15 providing those services.
- Sec. 113.0156. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than July 31 of
- 17 each year, the consortium shall submit to the governor, the
- 18 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 19 and the standing committee of each house of the legislature with
- 20 primary jurisdiction over behavioral health issues and post on its
- 21 Internet website a written report that outlines:
- 22 <u>(1) the activities and objectives of the consortium;</u>
- 23 (2) the health-related institutions of higher
- 24 education listed in Section 113.0052 awarded grants or other
- 25 funding by the executive committee;
- 26 (3) any prospective grants or funding the consortium
- 27 expects to receive; and

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1 (4) any research accomplishments associated with the

2 <u>consortium.</u>

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## SUBCHAPTER E. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 4 <u>Sec. 113.0201. JUDICIAL INSTRUCTION REGARDING MENTAL</u> 5 HEALTH CARE RESOURCES. The Supreme Court of Texas and the Texas
- 6 Court of Criminal Appeals, in consultation with the consortium,
- 7 shall develop a training program to educate and inform designated
- 8 judges and their staff on mental health care resources available
- 9 within the geographic region in which the designated judges
- 10 preside. The Supreme Court of Texas and the Texas Court of Criminal
- 11 Appeals may develop and operate the training program in conjunction
- 12 with any other training programs.
- 13 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 14 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 15 Services Commission and the members of the executive committee
- 16 described by Section 113.0101(1), Health and Safety Code, as added
- 17 by this Act, shall make the appointments and designations required
- 18 by Section 113.0101, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
