5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 1369, Insurance Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1369.2581 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1369.2581. AUDIT DISCREPANCIES; WHOLESALE INVOICES.
8	(a) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager that
9	audits wholesale invoices during an audit of a pharmacist or
10	pharmacy may not audit the pharmacy claims of another health
11	benefit plan or pharmacy benefit manager.
12	(b) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager
13	shall reverse a finding of a discrepancy if:
14	(1) the National Drug Code for the dispensed drug is in
15	a quantity that is a subunit or multiple of the drug purchased by
16	the pharmacist or pharmacy as supported by a wholesale invoice;
17	(2) the pharmacist or pharmacy dispensed the correct
18	quantity of the drug according to the prescription; and
19	(3) the drug dispensed by the pharmacist or pharmacy
20	shares all but the last two digits of the National Drug Code of the
21	drug reflected on the supplier invoice.
22	(c) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager
23	must accept as evidence to support the validity of a pharmacy claim

(1) subject to validation, including validation by 1 pharmacy purchase order and payment of a supplier invoice, copies 2 of supplier invoices in the pharmacist's or pharmacy's possession, 3 4 including: 5 (A) supplier invoices issued before the date the 6 drug was dispensed and not earlier than 60 days before the first day 7 of the audit period; and 8 (B) invoices and any supporting documents from any supplier authorized by federal or state law to transfer 9 ownership of the drug acquired by the pharmacist or pharmacy; and 10 (2) reports required by any state board or agency. 11 12 (d) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager must provide, not later than the fifth business day after the date 13 of a request by the pharmacist or pharmacy, any supporting 14 15 documents the pharmacist's or pharmacy's suppliers provided to the health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager. 16 17 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an audit conducted under a contract between a pharmacist or 18 pharmacy and a health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit 19 manager entered into, amended, or renewed on or after the effective 20 date of this Act. 21
