	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the audit of wholesale invoices during certain audits
3	of pharmacists and pharmacies.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 1369, Insurance Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1369.2581 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1369.2581. AUDIT DISCREPANCIES; WHOLESALE INVOICES.
8	(a) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager that
9	audits wholesale invoices during an audit of a pharmacist or
10	pharmacy may not audit the pharmacy claims of another health
11	benefit plan or pharmacy benefit manager.
12	(b) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager
13	shall reverse a finding of a discrepancy if:
14	(1) the National Drug Code for the dispensed drug is in
15	a quantity that is a subunit or multiple of the drug purchased by
16	the pharmacist or pharmacy as supported by a wholesale invoice;
17	(2) the pharmacist or pharmacy dispensed the correct
18	quantity of the drug; and
19	(3) the dispensed drug is identical in strength and
20	dosage to the drug purchased by the pharmacist or pharmacy from the
21	wholesaler.
22	(c) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager
23	must accept as evidence to support the validity of a pharmacy claim
24	related to a dispensed drug:

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1	(1) copies of supplier invoices in the pharmacist's or
2	pharmacy's possession, including:
3	(A) supplier invoices issued before the date the
4	drug was dispensed; and
5	(B) invoices from any supplier authorized to
6	transfer ownership of the drug acquired by the pharmacist or
7	pharmacy; and
8	(2) reports required by any state board or agency.
9	(d) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager
10	must provide, not later than the fifth business day after a request
11	by the pharmacist or pharmacy, any supporting documents the
12	pharmacist's or pharmacy's suppliers provided to the health benefit
13	plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager.
14	(e) A health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit manager
15	may not recoup any amount based on a wholesale invoice discrepancy
16	regarding the patient's receipt of a dispensed drug if the audited
17	pharmacy claim is supported by records of the pharmacist or
18	pharmacy showing that the patient or patient's agent received the
19	dispensed drug underlying the audited pharmacy claim.
20	SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
21	an audit conducted under a contract between a pharmacist or
22	pharmacy and a health benefit plan issuer or pharmacy benefit
23	manager entered into, amended, or renewed on or after the effective
24	date of this Act.
25	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
