1	AN ACT
2	relating to disclosure of certain relationships with local
3	government officers and vendors.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections $176.001(1)$, $(1-a)$, and $(2-d)$, Local
6	Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
7	(1) "Agent" means a third party who undertakes to
8	transact some business or manage some affair for another person by
9	the authority or on account of the other person. The term includes
10	a subcontractor and an employee.
11	(1-a) "Business relationship" means a connection
12	between two or more parties based on commercial activity of one of
13	the parties. [The term does not include a connection based on:
14	[(A) a transaction that is subject to rate or fee
15	regulation by a federal, state, or local governmental entity or ar
16	agency of a federal, state, or local governmental entity;
17	[(B) a transaction conducted at a price and
18	subject to terms available to the public; or
19	[(C) a purchase or lease of goods or services
20	from a person that is chartered by a state or federal agency and
21	that is subject to regular examination by, and reporting to, that
22	agency.]
23	(2-d) "Investment income" means dividends, capital

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gains, or interest income generated from:

1	(A) a personal or business:
2	(i) checking or savings account;
3	(ii) share draft or share account; or
4	(iii) other similar account;
5	(B) a personal or business investment other than
6	an investment in a:
7	(i) mutual fund; or
8	(ii) publicly traded company with a market
9	<pre>capitalization of \$2 billion or more; [ex]</pre>
10	(C) a personal or business loan; or
11	(D) a trust.
12	SECTION 2. Sections 176.003(a) and (e), Local Government
13	Code, are amended to read as follows:
14	(a) A local government officer shall file a conflicts
15	disclosure statement with respect to a vendor if:
16	(1) the vendor enters into a contract with the local
17	governmental entity or the local governmental entity is considering
18	entering into a contract with the vendor; and
19	(2) the vendor:
20	(A) has an employment or other business
21	relationship with the local government officer $\underline{\prime}$ [$rac{f or}{f c}$] a family
22	member of the officer, or a business entity in which the officer or
23	a family member of the officer holds an ownership interest or is an
24	<pre>employee, that results in the officer, [ex] family member, or</pre>
25	<pre>business entity receiving taxable income, including [other than]</pre>
26	investment income, that exceeds \$2,500 during the 12-month period
27	preceding the date that the officer becomes aware that:

- 1 (i) a contract between the local
- 2 governmental entity and vendor has been executed; or
- 3 (ii) the local governmental entity is
- 4 considering entering into a contract with the vendor;
- 5 (B) has an employment or other business
- 6 relationship with the local government officer, a family member of
- 7 the officer, or a business entity in which the officer or a family
- 8 member of the officer holds an ownership interest or is an employee,
- 9 that the officer anticipates will result in the officer, family
- 10 member, or business entity receiving any amount of taxable income,
- 11 including investment income, in the future;
- 12 (C) has given to the local government officer,
- 13 [or] a family member of the officer, or a business entity in which
- 14 the officer or a family member of the officer holds an ownership
- 15 <u>interest or is an employee</u>, one or more gifts that have an aggregate
- 16 value of more than \$100 in the 12-month period preceding the date
- 17 the officer becomes aware that:
- 18 (i) a contract between the local
- 19 governmental entity and vendor has been executed; or
- 20 (ii) the local governmental entity is
- 21 considering entering into a contract with the vendor; or
- 22 $\underline{\text{(D)}}$ [(C)] has a family relationship with the
- 23 local government officer.
- 24 (e) The commission shall adopt the conflicts disclosure
- 25 statement for local government officers for use under this
- 26 section. The conflicts disclosure statement must include:
- 27 (1) a requirement that each local government officer

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1 disclose:
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- 2 (A) an employment or other business relationship
- 3 described by Subsection (a)(2)(A) or (B), including the nature and
- 4 extent of the relationship; and
- 5 (B) gifts accepted by the local government
- 6 officer, [and] any family member of the officer, and any business
- 7 entity in which the officer or a family member of the officer holds
- 8 an ownership interest or is an employee, from a vendor during the
- 9 12-month period described by Subsection (a)(2)(C) $[\frac{(a)(2)(B)}{(B)}]$ if
- 10 the aggregate value of the gifts accepted by the officer, [or a]
- 11 family member, or business entity from that vendor exceeds \$100;
- 12 (2) an acknowledgment from the local government
- 13 officer that:
- 14 (A) the disclosure applies to each:
- (i) family member of the officer; and
- (ii) business entity in which the officer
- or a family member of the officer holds an ownership interest or is
- 18 an employee; and
- 19 (B) the statement covers the 12-month period
- 20 described by Subsection (a)(2)(C) [(a)(2)(B)]; and
- 21 (3) the signature of the local government officer
- 22 acknowledging that the statement is made under oath under penalty
- 23 of perjury.
- 24 SECTION 3. Sections 176.006(a), (a-1), and (c), Local
- 25 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) A vendor shall file a completed conflict of interest
- 27 questionnaire if the vendor has a business relationship with a

- 1 local governmental entity and:
- 2 (1) has an employment or other business relationship
- 3 described by Section 176.003(a)(2)(A) or (B) with a local
- 4 government officer of that local governmental entity, [or] a family
- 5 member of the officer, or a business entity in which the officer or
- 6 a family member of the officer holds an ownership interest or is an
- 7 employee [described by Section 176.003(a)(2)(A)];
- 8 (2) has given a local government officer of that local
- 9 governmental entity, [or] a family member of the officer, or a
- 10 business entity in which the officer or a family member of the
- 11 officer holds an ownership interest or is an employee, one or more
- 12 gifts with the aggregate value specified by Section
- 13 $176.003(a)(2)(C) \left[\frac{176.003(a)(2)(B)}{(B)}\right]$, excluding any gift described
- 14 by Section 176.003(a-1); or
- 15 (3) has a family relationship with a local government
- 16 officer of that local governmental entity.
- 17 (a-1) The completed conflict of interest questionnaire must
- 18 be filed with the appropriate records administrator not later than
- 19 the seventh business day after the later of:
- 20 (1) the date that the vendor:
- 21 (A) begins discussions or negotiations to enter
- 22 into a contract with the local governmental entity; or
- 23 (B) submits to the local governmental entity an
- 24 application, response to a request for proposals or bids,
- 25 correspondence, or another writing related to a potential contract
- 26 with the local governmental entity; or
- 27 (2) the date the vendor becomes aware:

- 1 (A) of an employment or other business
- 2 relationship [with a local government officer, or a family member
- 3 of the officer, described by Subsection (a)(1) [(a)];
- 4 (B) that the vendor has given one or more gifts
- 5 described by Subsection (a)(2) $[\frac{a}{a}]$; or
- 6 (C) of a family relationship with a local
- 7 government officer.
- 8 (c) The questionnaire adopted under Subsection (b) must
- 9 require, for the local governmental entity with respect to which
- 10 the questionnaire is filed, that the vendor filing the
- 11 questionnaire:
- 12 (1) describe each employment or business [and family]
- 13 relationship described by Section 176.003(a)(2)(A) or (B) the
- 14 vendor has with each local government officer of the local
- 15 governmental entity, a family member of the officer, or a business
- 16 entity in which the officer or a family member of the officer holds
- 17 <u>an ownership interest or is an employee;</u>
- 18 (2) describe each family relationship the vendor has
- 19 with each local government officer of the local governmental
- 20 entity;
- 21 (3) identify each employment or business relationship
- 22 described by Subdivision (1) with respect to which the local
- 23 government officer, a family member of the officer, or a business
- 24 entity in which the officer or a family member of the officer holds
- 25 <u>an ownership interest or is an employee</u>, receives, or is likely to
- 26 receive, taxable income, including [other than] investment income,
- 27 from the vendor;

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- 1 (4) (4) (3) identify each employment or business
- 2 relationship described by Subdivision (1) with respect to which the
- 3 vendor receives, or is likely to receive, taxable income, including
- 4 [other than] investment income, that:
- 5 (A) is received from, or at the direction of, a
- 6 local government officer of the local governmental entity, a family
- 7 member of the officer, or a business entity in which the officer or
- 8 a family member of the officer holds an ownership interest or is an
- 9 employee; and
- 10 (B) is not received from the local governmental
- 11 entity; and
- (5) $[\frac{4}{1}]$ describe each employment or business
- 13 relationship with a corporation or other business entity with
- 14 respect to which a local government officer of the local
- 15 governmental entity[+

- 17 [(B) holds an ownership interest of one percent
- 19 SECTION 4. Not later than December 1, 2019, the Texas Ethics
- 20 Commission shall adopt a conflicts disclosure statement consistent
- 21 with Section 176.003, Local Government Code, as amended by this
- 22 Act, and a conflict of interest questionnaire consistent with
- 23 Section 176.006, Local Government Code, as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 25 an event requiring disclosure that occurs on or after January 1,
- 26 2020. An event requiring disclosure that occurs before that date is
- 27 governed by the law applicable to the event immediately before that

- 1 date, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 2 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
