## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to assessment of public school students, providing
- 3 accelerated instruction, appropriately crediting certain student
- 4 performance, and eliminating requirements based on performance on
- 5 certain assessment instruments.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 11, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 11.184 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 11.184. SCHOOL DISTRICT ACCELERATED LEARNING
- 10 COMMITTEE POLICY. (a) The board of trustees of a school district
- 11 shall adopt a policy regarding the establishment of accelerated
- 12 <u>learning committees under Section 28.0211.</u> The policy must
- 13 specify:

- 14 (1) the composition of a committee;
- 15 (2) the frequency of committee meetings during the
- 16 school year;
- 17 (3) the agenda, content, and purpose of meetings,
- 18 including whether the committee will consider a student's grades,
- 19 attendance, behavior, including disciplinary measures, vision, and
- 20 <u>social-emotional health;</u>
- 21 (4) the objectives and goals of educational plans
- 22 <u>developed for providing the necessary accelerated instruction to</u>
- 23 the student;
- 24 <u>(5) methods for measuring the efficacy of an</u>

- 1 accelerated instruction program;
- 2 <u>(6) whether, for a student in a special education</u>
- 3 program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission,
- 4 review, and dismissal committee will serve as the accelerated
- 5 learning committee in developing the educational plan for the
- 6 student's accelerated instruction program; and
- 7 (7) whether an accelerated learning committee will
- 8 include a response-to-intervention approach in administering the
- 9 educational plan for a student's accelerated instruction program.
- 10 (b) The policy must require that, to the extent practicable,
- 11 school personnel assigned to a student's accelerated learning
- 12 committee remain assigned to that committee for the duration of the
- 13 period for which the student receives accelerated instruction.
- 14 (c) A superintendent of a school district or principal of a
- 15 campus is not required to serve on an accelerated learning
- 16 committee.
- 17 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 28.0211, Education Code,
- 18 is amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 28.0211. ACCELERATED LEARNING COMMITTEE [SATISFACTORY
- 20 PERFORMANCE ON ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS REQUIRED]; ACCELERATED
- 21 INSTRUCTION.
- SECTION 3. Section 28.0211, Education Code, is amended by
- 23 amending Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-3), (c), (f), (i), and (n) and
- 24 adding Subsections (f-1) and (f-2) to read as follows:
- 25 (a) A district shall establish an accelerated learning
- 26 committee described by Subsection (c) for each student who does not
- 27 perform satisfactorily on:

- 3 (2) [Except as provided by Subsection (b) or (e), a
  4 student may not be promoted to:
- [(1) the sixth grade program to which the student would otherwise be assigned if the student does not perform satisfactorily on] the fifth grade mathematics or [and] reading assessment instrument [instruments] under Section 39.023; or
- 9 <u>(3)</u> [(2) the ninth grade program to which the student
  10 would otherwise be assigned if the student does not perform
  11 satisfactorily on] the eighth grade mathematics or [and] reading
  12 assessment instrument [instruments] under Section 39.023.
- (a-1) Each time a student fails to perform satisfactorily on 13 14 an assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(a) in 15 the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, or eighth grade, the school district in which the student attends school shall provide 16 17 to the student accelerated instruction in the applicable subject area. Accelerated instruction may require participation of the 18 19 student before or after normal school hours, [and] may include participation at times of the year outside normal school 20 operations, and may be provided to the student during the 21 subsequent school year. 22
- (a-3) The commissioner shall provide guidelines to districts on research-based best practices and effective strategies that a district may use in developing an accelerated instruction program. The commissioner may provide to districts available resources concerning research-based best practices and

1 effective strategies that a district may use in developing an
2 accelerated instruction program.

- [Each time a student fails to perform satisfactorily on 3 an assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a), the school 4 5 district in which the student attends school shall provide to the student accelerated instruction in the applicable subject area, 6 including reading instruction for a student who fails to perform 7 8 satisfactorily on a reading assessment instrument. student fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument 9 10 specified under Subsection (a) [a second time], an accelerated learning [a grade placement] committee shall be established in 11 12 accordance with the district's policy adopted under Section 11.184 [to prescribe the accelerated instruction the district shall 13 14 provide to the student before the student is administered the assessment instrument the third time. The grade placement 15 committee shall be composed of the principal or the principal's 16 17 designee, the student's parent or quardian, and the teacher of the subject of an assessment instrument on which the student failed to 18 perform satisfactorily]. The district shall notify the parent or 19 guardian of the time and place for convening the accelerated 20 21 <u>learning</u> [grade placement] committee and the purpose of the committee. [An accelerated instruction group administered by a 22 school district under this section may not have a ratio of more than 23 24 10 students for each teacher.
- 25 (f) An accelerated learning [A school district shall 26 provide to a student who, after three attempts, has failed to 27 perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under

- 1 Subsection (a) accelerated instruction during the next school year
- 2 as prescribed by an educational plan developed for the student by
- 3 the student's grade placement] committee described by [established
- 4 under] Subsection (c) shall:
- 5 (1) develop an educational plan for the student that
- 6 provides the necessary accelerated instruction to enable the
- 7 student to perform at the appropriate grade level by the conclusion
- 8 of the subsequent school year; and
- 9 (2) provide other assistance to the student in
- 10 accordance with a policy adopted by the district board of trustees
- 11 prescribing the role of accelerated learning committees in that
- 12 district. [The district shall provide that accelerated instruction
- 13 regardless of whether the student has been promoted or retained.
- 14 (f-1) A student for whom an  $[\frac{The}{}]$  educational plan is
- 15 <u>developed under Subsection (f)(1)</u> [must be designed to enable the
- 16 student to perform at the appropriate grade level by the conclusion
- 17 of the school year. During the school year, the student] shall be
- 18 monitored to ensure that the student is progressing in accordance
- 19 with the plan. The district shall administer to the student the
- 20 assessment instrument for the grade level in which the student is
- 21 placed at the time the district regularly administers the
- 22 assessment instruments for that school year.
- 23 <u>(f-2) If a student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an</u>
- 24 assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) fails in the
- 25 subsequent school year to perform satisfactorily on an assessment
- 26 <u>instrument in the same subject, the superintendent of the district</u>
- 27 or the superintendent's designee shall meet with the student's

- 1 accelerated learning committee to:
- 2 (1) identify the reason the student did not perform
- 3 satisfactorily; and
- 4 (2) determine, in order to ensure the student performs
- 5 satisfactorily on the assessment instrument at the next opportunity
- 6 for the student to be administered the assessment instrument,
- 7 whether:
- 8 (A) the educational plan developed for the
- 9 student under Subsection (f) must be modified to provide the
- 10 necessary accelerated instruction for that student; and
- 11 (B) any additional resources are required for
- 12 that student.
- 13 (i) The admission, review, and dismissal committee of a
- 14 student who participates in a district's special education program
- 15 under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, and who does not perform
- 16 satisfactorily on an assessment instrument specified under
- 17 Subsection (a) and administered under Section 39.023(a) or (b) must
- 18 meet before the student is administered the assessment instrument
- 19 for the second time. The committee shall determine [+
- $[\frac{1}{2}]$  the manner in which the student will participate
- 21 in an accelerated instruction program under this section[; and
- [(2) whether the student will be promoted in
- 23 accordance with Subsection (i-1) or retained under this section].
- 24 (n) A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on an
- 25 assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) and is
- 26 promoted to the next grade level [by a grade placement committee
- 27 under this section] must be assigned at that next grade level in

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- 1 each subject in which the student failed to perform satisfactorily
- 2 on an assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a) to a
- 3 teacher who meets all state and federal qualifications to teach
- 4 that subject and grade.
- 5 SECTION 4. Sections 39.023(a), (c), (c-3), and (e),
- 6 Education Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
- 8 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
- 9 essential knowledge and skills in reading, writing, mathematics,
- 10 [social studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection
- 11 (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
- 12 (b) or (l) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
- 13 (1) mathematics, annually in grades three through
- 14 seven without the aid of technology and in grade eight with the aid
- 15 of technology on any assessment instrument that includes algebra;
- 16 (2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;
- 17 (3) writing, including spelling and grammar, in grades
- 18 four and seven; and
- 19 (4) [social studies, in grade eight;
- 20  $\left[\frac{(5)}{}\right]$  science, in grades five and eight  $\left[\frac{1}{7}\right]$
- [(6) any other subject and grade required by federal
- 22 <del>law</del>].
- (c) The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment
- 24 instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, biology,
- 25 English I, and English II[, and United States history]. The
- 26 Algebra I end-of-course assessment instrument must be administered
- 27 with the aid of technology. The English I and English II

- 1 end-of-course assessment instruments must each assess essential knowledge and skills in both reading and writing in the same 2 3 assessment instrument and must provide a single score. A school district shall comply with State Board of Education rules regarding 4 5 administration of the assessment instruments listed in this subsection. If a student is in a special education program under 6 Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and 7 8 dismissal committee shall determine whether any allowable modification is necessary in administering to the student an 9 10 assessment instrument required under this subsection. The agency [State Board of Education] shall administer the assessment 11 12 instruments. The commissioner, with input from school districts, [State Board of Education] shall adopt a schedule for the 13 14 administration of end-of-course assessment instruments 15 complies with the requirements of Subsection (c-3).
- 16 (c-3) The commissioner, with input from school districts
  17 and other appropriate stakeholders, shall adopt [In adopting] a
  18 schedule for the administration of assessment instruments under
  19 this section that[, the State Board of Education shall require]:
- (1) minimizes the disruption of classroom instruction
  [assessment instruments administered under Subsection (a) to be
  administered on a schedule so that the first assessment instrument
  is administered at least two weeks later than the date on which the
  first assessment instrument was administered under Subsection (a)
  during the 2006-2007 school year]; and
- 26 (2) <u>maximizes available instruction time by</u>
  27 <u>scheduling</u> the spring administration of [<del>end-of-course</del>] assessment

- 1 instruments [under Subsection (c)] to occur as close to the end of
- 2 the semester as possible, but not later than the second week of May
- 3 [in each school district not earlier than the first full week in
- 4 May, except that the spring administration of the end-of-course
- 5 assessment instruments in English I and English II must be
- 6 permitted to occur at an earlier date].
- 7 (e) At least [Under rules adopted by the State Board of
- 8  $\frac{\text{Education}_{7}}{\text{every}}$  every third year, the agency shall release the
- 9 questions and answer keys to each assessment instrument
- 10 administered under Subsection (a), (b), (c), (d), or (l), excluding
- 11 any assessment instrument administered to a student for the purpose
- 12 of retaking the assessment instrument, after the last time the
- 13 instrument is administered for that school year. To ensure a valid
- 14 bank of questions for use each year, the agency is not required to
- 15 release a question that is being field-tested and was not used to
- 16 compute the student's score on the instrument. The agency shall
- 17 also release[, under board rule,] each question that is no longer
- 18 being field-tested and that was not used to compute a student's
- 19 score. [During the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 school years, the
- 20 agency shall release the questions and answer keys to assessment
- 21 instruments as described by this subsection each year.
- SECTION 5. Section 39.025(a-2), Education Code, as added by
- 23 Chapter 1036 (H.B. 1613), Acts of the 84th Legislature, Regular
- 24 Session, 2015, is amended to read as follows:
- 25 (a-2) The commissioner shall determine a method by which a
- 26 student's satisfactory performance on an advanced placement test,
- 27 an international baccalaureate examination, an SAT Subject Test,

1 the SAT, the ACT, the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) diagnostic nationally recognized norm-referenced any 2 assessment, or 3 assessment instrument used by institutions of higher education to award course credit based on satisfactory performance on the 4 5 assessment instrument shall be used to satisfy the requirements concerning an end-of-course assessment instrument in an equivalent 6 course as prescribed by Subsection (a). The commissioner shall 7 8 determine a method by which a student's satisfactory performance on the PSAT or the ACT-Plan shall be used to satisfy the requirements 9 10 concerning an end-of-course assessment instrument in an equivalent course as prescribed by Subsection (a). <u>In adopting methods for</u> 11 12 substituting satisfactory performance on an assessment instrument authorized under this subsection for requirements concerning an 13 end-of-course assessment instrument, the commissioner shall 14 designate a student's performance on a substitute assessment 15 instrument as "masters grade-level performance" if the student's 16 17 performance entitles the student to receive college credit or if the student's performance meets the assessment instrument 18 19 provider's designated grade-level college readiness performance 20 benchmark. A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on a substitute [test or other] assessment instrument authorized under 21 this subsection[, other than the PSAT or the ACT-Plan, may retake 22 23 that [test or other] assessment instrument for purposes of this 24 subsection or may take the appropriate end-of-course assessment instrument. [A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on the 25 26 PSAT or the ACT-Plan must take the appropriate end-of-course assessment instrument.] The commissioner shall adopt rules as 27

- 1 necessary for the administration of this subsection.
- 2 SECTION 6. Section 39.025, Education Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsection (a-5) to read as follows:
- 4 (a-5) The commissioner shall implement the changes in law
- 5 made by H.B. 1480, 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, to
- 6 Section 39.025(a-2), as added by Chapter 1036 (H.B. 1613), Acts of
- 7 the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, and Section
- 8 39.053(c-4) effective beginning with the 2019-2020 accountability
- 9 rating period. This subsection expires September 1, 2020.
- 10 SECTION 7. Section 39.025(c-2), Education Code, as
- 11 effective September 1, 2019, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 (c-2) A school district may administer to a student who
- 13 failed to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument
- 14 described by Subsection (c-1) an alternate assessment instrument
- 15 designated by the commissioner. The commissioner shall determine
- 16 the level of performance considered to be satisfactory on an
- 17 alternate assessment instrument. [The district may not administer
- 18 to the student an assessment instrument or a part of an assessment
- 19 instrument that assesses a subject that was not assessed in an
- 20 assessment instrument applicable to the student described by
- 21 Subsection (c-1). The commissioner shall make available to
- 22 districts information necessary to administer the alternate
- 23 assessment instrument authorized by this subsection. The
- 24 commissioner's determination regarding designation of an
- 25 appropriate alternate assessment instrument under this subsection
- 26 and the performance required on the assessment instrument is final
- 27 and may not be appealed.

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- 1 SECTION 8. Section 39.053, Education Code, is amended by
- 2 adding Subsection (c-4) to read as follows:
- 3 (c-4) The commissioner by rule shall determine a method for
- 4 appropriately crediting a student for growth under Subsection
- 5 (c)(2) based on the student's performance, including a student's
- 6 "masters grade-level performance," on a substitute assessment
- 7 <u>instrument authorized under Section 39.025(a-2)</u>, as added by
- 8 Chapter 1036 (H.B. 1613), Acts of the 84th Legislature, Regular
- 9 Session, 2015.
- SECTION 9. Section 39.203(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (c) In addition to the distinction designations described
- 13 by Subsections (a) and (b), a campus that satisfies the criteria
- 14 developed under Section 39.204 shall be awarded a distinction
- 15 designation by the commissioner for outstanding performance in
- 16 academic achievement in reading [English language arts],
- 17 mathematics, or science[ , or social studies].
- SECTION 10. Section 39.301(c), Education Code, is amended

- 21 postsecondary readiness assessment instruments adopted under
- 22 Section 39.0238 for Algebra II and English III, as that section
- 23 <u>existed before repeal by H.B. 1480, 86th Legislature, Regular</u>
- 24 <u>Session, 2019,</u> is exempt from the requirements of this subchapter
- 25 with respect to those content areas. The commissioner of higher
- 26 education by rule shall establish the period for which an exemption
- 27 under this subsection is valid.

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- 1 SECTION 12. The following provisions of the Education Code 2 are repealed:
- 3 (1) Section 7.102(c)(5);
- 4 (2) Sections 28.0211(a-2), (b), (d), (e), (i-1),
- 5 (i-2), (k), (m), and (m-1); and
- 6 (3) Section 39.0238.
- 7 SECTION 13. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 8 school year.
- 9 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 10 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 11 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 12 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 13 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
