A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to claiming an exemption from required immunizations for
- 3 public school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 161.0041(d) and (e), Health and Safety
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (d) The department shall develop a blank affidavit form to
- 8 be used by a person claiming an exemption from a required
- 9 <u>immunization</u> and make that form available on the department's
- 10 Internet website and in all public schools [that contains a seal or
- 11 other security device to prevent reproduction of the form]. The
- 12 affidavit form shall contain a statement indicating that the person
- 13 or, if a minor, the person's parent, managing conservator, or
- 14 guardian understands the benefits and risks of immunizations and
- 15 the benefits and risks of not being immunized.
- 16 (e) [The department shall maintain a record of the total
- 17 number of affidavit forms sent out each year and shall report that
- 18 information to the legislature each year. The department may not
- 19 maintain a record of the number of affidavit forms submitted or the
- 20 names of individuals who <u>submit</u> [<u>request</u>] an affidavit form under
- 21 this section.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 161.0041(c), Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 repealed.
- 24 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date

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- 1 of this Act, the Department of State Health Services shall modify
- 2 the existing affidavit form required by Section 161.0041, Health
- 3 and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
