4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 2, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
6	amended by adding Article 2.296 to read as follows:
7	Art. 2.296. NOTICE REGARDING POSSIBLE SCHOOL VIOLENCE. (a)
8	In this article, "school violence" means any offense:
9	(1) involving violence that may result in death or
10	serious bodily injury to any person; and
11	(2) that occurs at a primary or secondary school.
12	(b) A law enforcement officer who receives a report or finds
13	evidence that suggests a person may be contemplating committing an
14	act of school violence at a public school in this state shall, as
15	soon as practicable, deliver written notice of the threat to the
16	superintendent of the affected school or a person designated by the
17	superintendent.
18	(c) The superintendent or person designated by the
19	superintendent shall, on receiving notice under this article,
20	notify appropriate instructional and support personnel. All
21	personnel shall keep the information received under this article
22	confidential.
23	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
24	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
