## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to consent instruction and instruction on the prevention
- 3 of sexual abuse and sex trafficking for certain public school
- 4 students.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 28.0045 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 28.0045. CONSENT INSTRUCTION. (a) A school district
- 9 shall include in the district's health curriculum for students in
- 10 kindergarten through fifth grade instruction on the importance of
- 11 obtaining a person's consent before engaging in any physical
- 12 activity with that person.
- 13 (b) The State Board of Education shall adopt the essential
- 14 knowledge and skills for age-appropriate curricula to be used by a
- 15 school district in providing consent instruction under this
- 16 section.
- 17 <u>(c)</u> A school district shall ensure that each student in
- 18 kindergarten through fifth grade receives consent instruction
- 19 under this section at least once in each grade level, unless the
- 20 student's parent removes the student from the instruction for the
- 21 applicable grade level.
- 22 <u>(d) Before the beginning of each school year, a school</u>
- 23 district shall provide to the parent of each student enrolled in the
- 24 district in kindergarten through fifth grade written notice that

- 1 <u>includes:</u>
- 2 (1) a statement that the district will provide consent
- 3 instruction as provided by this section to students in the
- 4 applicable grade level;
- 5 (2) a description of the material that will be used in
- 6 providing instruction to those students; and
- 7 (3) a statement that the parent has the right to review
- 8 the material and remove the parent's student from the instruction.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 28.017, Education Code, as added by
- 10 Chapter 762 (S.B. 2039), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
- 11 Session, 2017, is reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 28.017. INSTRUCTION ON PREVENTION OF SEXUAL ABUSE AND
- 13 SEX TRAFFICKING. (a) The commissioner, in cooperation with [the
- 14 human trafficking prevention task force created under Section
- 15 402.035, Government Code, and] any [other] persons the commissioner
- 16 considers appropriate, shall develop one or more sexual abuse and
- 17 sex trafficking instructional modules for use by [that] a school
- 18 district as provided by this section [may use in the district's
- 19 health curriculum]. The modules may include:
- 20 (1) information on the different forms of sexual abuse
- 21 and assault, sex trafficking, and risk factors for sex trafficking;
- 22 (2) the procedures for reporting sexual abuse and sex
- 23 trafficking or suspected sexual abuse or sex trafficking;
- 24 (3) strategies for sexual abuse and assault prevention
- 25 and overcoming peer pressure;
- 26 (4) information on establishing healthy boundaries
- 27 for relationships, recognizing potentially abusive or harmful

- 1 relationships, and avoiding high-risk activities;
- 2 (5) the recruiting tactics of sex traffickers and peer
- 3 recruiters, including recruitment through the Internet;
- 4 (6) the legal aspects of sexual abuse and sex
- 5 trafficking under state and federal law; and
- 6 (7) the influence of culture and mass media on
- 7 perceptions of sexual abuse and sex trafficking, including
- 8 stereotypes and myths about victims and abusers, victim blaming,
- 9 and the role of language.
- 10 <u>(a-1)</u> As age-appropriate, a school district:
- 11 (1) shall use the modules developed under Subsection
- 12 (a) in the district's health curriculum for students in grade
- 13 levels 6 through 12; and
- 14 (2) may use those modules in the district's health
- 15 curriculum for students not described by Subdivision (1).
- 16 (a-2) A school district shall ensure that each student in
- 17 grade levels 9 through 12 receives age-appropriate instruction
- 18 using the modules developed under Subsection (a) at least once in
- 19 each grade level, unless the student's parent removes the student
- 20 from the instruction for the applicable grade level.
- 21 (b) The module or modules developed under Subsection (a)
- 22 must emphasize compassion for victims of sexual abuse or sex
- 23 trafficking and the creation of a positive reentry experience for
- 24 survivors of sexual abuse or sex trafficking into schools.
- 25 (c) Before the beginning of each school year, a school
- 26 district [that elects to use a module developed under Subsection
- 27 (a) in the district's health curriculum] shall provide [written

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- 1 notice] to the parent of each student enrolled in the district in a
- 2 grade level for which a module developed under Subsection (a) will
- 3 <u>be used written notice</u> that includes [the following]:
- 4 (1) a statement that the district will provide
- 5 instruction relating to sexual abuse and sex trafficking awareness
- 6 to students in the applicable grade level [enrolled in the
- 7 district];
- 8 (2) a description of the material that will be used in
- 9 providing instruction to those students; and
- 10 (3) a statement that the parent has the right to review
- 11 the material and remove the parent's student from the instruction.
- 12 (d) If a school district does not comply with the
- 13 requirements of Subsection (c), a parent of a student enrolled in
- 14 the district may file a complaint in accordance with the district's
- 15 grievance procedure developed under Section 26.011.
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2020-2021
- 17 school year.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
