- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Title 2, Government Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subtitle K-1 to read as follows:
- 7 SUBTITLE K-1. SPECIALTY COURTS FOR VICTIMS
- 8 CHAPTER 141. SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIM SERVICES COURT PROGRAM
- 9 Sec. 141.001. SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIM SERVICES COURT PROGRAM
- 10 DEFINED. In this chapter, "sexual assault victim services court
- 11 program" means a program that has the following essential
- 12 <u>characteristics:</u>
- 13 (1) the integration of services provided by public
- 14 agencies and community organizations for victims in sexual assault
- 15 cases;
- 16 (2) the use of prosecutors with experience in
- 17 prosecuting sexual assault cases and judges with experience in
- 18 hearing sexual assault cases;
- 19 (3) early identification and prompt assignment of
- 20 eligible cases to the court designated under Section 141.002(b);
- 21 (4) access by victims to counseling and other related
- 22 services provided by public agencies and community organizations;
- 23 (5) development of partnerships with public agencies
- 24 and community organizations;

- 1 (6) monitoring and evaluation of program goals and
- 2 effectiveness;
- 3 (7) continuing interdisciplinary education to promote
- 4 effective program planning, implementation, and operations;
- 5 (8) inclusion of a participant's family members who
- 6 agree to be involved in the services provided to the participant
- 7 under the program;
- 8 (9) prosecution of sexual assault offenses;
- 9 (10) issuance of orders of protection to victims on
- 10 the victim's consent and as authorized by state law; and
- 11 (11) continued monitoring of sexual assault
- 12 defendants through prosecution and adjudication and for the
- 13 <u>duration of an offender's sentence.</u>
- 14 Sec. 141.002. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH PROGRAM; ELIGIBILITY.
- 15 (a) The commissioners court of a county may establish a sexual
- 16 <u>assault victim services court program for participants who are</u>
- 17 victims of an alleged sexual assault in which a person is arrested
- 18 for or charged with an offense under Chapter 21 or 22, Penal Code.
- 19 (b) The local administrative judge, for the courts for which
- 20 the judge serves as local administrative judge, may designate a
- 21 court in the county for assignment of cases described by Subsection
- 22 (a). The judge of the court must have experience hearing sexual
- 23 assault cases under Chapter 21 or 22, Penal Code. The prosecuting
- 24 attorney for the court must have experience in prosecuting sexual
- 25 assault offenses under Chapter 21 or 22, Penal Code.
- Sec. 141.003. DUTIES OF SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIM SERVICES
- 27 COURT PROGRAM. (a) A sexual assault victim services court program

- 1 established under this chapter must:
- 2 (1) ensure that a victim eligible for participation in
- 3 the program volunteers to proceed through the program; and
- 4 (2) allow a participant to withdraw from the program
- 5 at any time.
- 6 (b) A sexual assault victim services court program
- 7 established under this chapter shall make, establish, and publish
- 8 <u>local procedures to ensure maximum participation of eligible</u>
- 9 victims in the county.
- Sec. 141.004. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. A county may
- 11 accept a gift, grant, donation, or bequest of money, services,
- 12 equipment, goods, or other tangible or intangible property from any
- 13 source for the sexual assault victim services court program.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
