A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 1 | AN ACT |
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- 2 relating to establishing the Mental Health Crisis and Suicide
- 3 Prevention Task Force.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
- 7 Commission.
- 8 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 9 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 10 (3) "N-1-1 dial code" means a three-digit telephone
- 11 number that connects users to a public safety answering point
- 12 through dialing the three-digit telephone number.
- 13 (4) "Statewide mental health crisis line" means a
- 14 telephonic or other electronic system operated 24 hours a day to
- 15 connect a mental or behavioral health professional with persons
- 16 experiencing a mental health crisis.
- 17 (5) "Task force" means the Mental Health Crisis and
- 18 Suicide Prevention Task Force.
- 19 SECTION 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF TASK FORCE. The Mental Health
- 20 Crisis and Suicide Prevention Task Force is established by the
- 21 executive commissioner to study the efficacy and feasibility of
- 22 creating a statewide mental health crisis line for treating mental
- 23 health crises and preventing suicide.
- 24 SECTION 3. COMPOSITION OF TASK FORCE. The task force is

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- 1 composed of:
- 2 (1) the governor's designee;
- 3 (2) two members of the senate, appointed by the
- 4 lieutenant governor;
- 5 (3) two members of the house of representatives,
- 6 appointed by the speaker of the house; and
- 7 (4) 10 members appointed by the executive commissioner
- 8 as follows:
- 9 (A) two representatives from the Commission on
- 10 State Emergency Communications;
- 11 (B) two representatives from the commission's
- 12 mental health crisis services office;
- 13 (C) two mental or behavioral health clinicians
- 14 licensed to practice in this state;
- 15 (D) two physicians licensed to practice in this
- 16 state, one of whom specializes in psychiatry;
- 17 (E) one social worker; and
- 18 (F) one community advocate in a relevant field.
- 19 SECTION 4. CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR. The executive
- 20 commissioner shall appoint from among the task force members a
- 21 chair and vice chair.
- 22 SECTION 5. MEETINGS; QUORUM. (a) The task force shall meet
- 23 at the call of the chair. The chair shall set the agenda for each
- 24 meeting.
- 25 (b) The action of a majority of a quorum constitutes the
- 26 action of the task force.
- 27 SECTION 6. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. (a) Except as

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- 1 provided by Subsection (b), a member of the task force may not
- 2 receive compensation or reimbursement for service on the task
- 3 force.
- 4 (b) A task force member who is a legislator engaged in the
- 5 business of the task force is entitled to compensation and expenses
- 6 as provided by Chapter 660, Government Code.
- 7 SECTION 7. STUDY; REPORT. (a) In cooperation with the
- 8 commission, the task force shall study:
- 9 (1) the efficacy and feasibility of designating an
- 10 N-1-1 dial code or another dialing code for use as a statewide
- 11 mental health crisis line; and
- 12 (2) the advantages and disadvantages of using a
- 13 particular statewide N-1-1 dial code or another dialing code for a
- 14 statewide mental health crisis line.
- 15 (b) Not later than September 1, 2020, the task force shall
- 16 prepare and submit to the legislature and the commission a written
- 17 report containing the results of the study and a recommendation as
- 18 to whether to establish a particular N-1-1 dial code or other
- 19 covered dialing code for use as a statewide mental health crisis
- 20 line.
- 21 (c) If the report submitted under Subsection (b) includes a
- 22 recommendation to establish a particular N-1-1 dial code or other
- 23 covered dialing code for use as a statewide mental health crisis
- 24 line, the report must also include:
- 25 (1) an outline of the logistics of designating that
- 26 dial code;
- 27 (2) an estimate of the costs associated with

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- 1 designating that dial code, including costs incurred by:
- 2 (A) service providers, including:
- 3 (i) translation changes in the network; and
- 4 (ii) cell site analysis and reprogramming
- 5 by wireless carriers; and
- 6 (B) the state and political subdivisions;
- 7 (3) recommendations for designating the dial code;
- 8 (4) a cost-benefit analysis comparing the recommended
- 9 dial code with the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, as the
- 10 lifeline exists on the date the report is submitted; and
- 11 (5) other recommendations as appropriate for
- 12 improving the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline generally,
- 13 which may include:
- 14 (A) increased public education and awareness;
- 15 and
- 16 (B) improved infrastructure and operations.
- 17 SECTION 8. FUNDING. The task force, through the
- 18 commission, may accept gifts and grants from any source to fund the
- 19 duties of the commission and the task force under this Act.
- 20 SECTION 9. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110,
- 21 Government Code, does not apply to the task force.
- 22 SECTION 10. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1,
- 23 2021.
- 24 SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 25 September 1, 2019.
