A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study on interest or other waiting lists maintained
- 3 for certain Medicaid programs providing services to persons with an
- 4 intellectual or developmental disability.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) The Health and Human Services Commission,
- 7 in consultation and collaboration with the Intellectual and
- 8 Developmental Disability System Redesign Advisory Committee
- 9 established under Section 534.053, Government Code, shall conduct a
- 10 study examining the interest or other waiting lists maintained for
- 11 the following Medicaid programs authorized under Section 1115 or
- 12 1915(c) of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1315
- 13 or 1396n(c)) that provide services to persons with an intellectual
- 14 or developmental disability:
- 15 (1) the community living assistance and support
- 16 services (CLASS) waiver program;
- 17 (2) the home and community-based services (HCS) waiver
- 18 program;
- 19 (3) the deaf-blind with multiple disabilities (DBMD)
- 20 waiver program;
- 21 (4) the Texas home living (TxHmL) waiver program;
- 22 (5) the medically dependent children (MDCP) waiver
- 23 program; and
- 24 (6) the STAR+PLUS home and community-based services

- 1 (HCBS) program.
- 2 (b) In conducting the study under this section, the Health
- 3 and Human Services Commission shall, for each Medicaid program
- 4 described by Subsection (a) of this section:
- 5 (1) consider and analyze:
- 6 (A) the experiences of other states in reducing
- 7 or eliminating interest or other waiting lists, including through
- 8 the range of services available to persons with an intellectual or
- 9 developmental disability in each state;
- 10 (B) factors affecting the historical experience
- 11 of each Medicaid program and the program's interest or waiting list
- 12 during the five most recent state fiscal biennia, including:
- (i) the amount of appropriated money
- 14 allocated to each program during each state fiscal year; and
- 15 (ii) significant policy changes impacting
- 16 each program and the program's interest or other waiting list;
- 17 (C) existing data relating to persons on an
- 18 interest or other waiting list, including demographic data and data
- 19 relating to each person's living arrangement, service preferences,
- 20 length of time on the list, and unmet support needs; and
- 21 (D) the urgency of the need for services of
- 22 persons on an interest or other waiting list at any given time,
- 23 including the extent to which the list is comprised of persons who:
- 24 (i) join the list before becoming eligible
- 25 for services under the associated Medicaid program; or
- 26 (ii) were eligible for services under the
- 27 associated Medicaid program at the time of joining the list but who

- 1 are no longer eligible for services under the program; and
- 2 (2) identify:
- 3 (A) additional strategies that the commission
- 4 could employ to eliminate the interest or other waiting lists in a
- 5 manner that results in the provision of person-centered services in
- 6 the most integrated setting, including strategies employed by other
- 7 states and strategies through which this state could receive
- 8 additional federal funding, and the estimated costs of implementing
- 9 those strategies; and
- 10 (B) a date by which the commission believes it
- 11 could eliminate the interest or other waiting lists if the
- 12 identified strategies were implemented.
- 13 (c) Not later than September 1, 2020, the Health and Human
- 14 Services Commission shall submit to the legislature a written
- 15 report containing the findings of the study conducted under this
- 16 Act and the commission's recommendations for:
- 17 (1) improving service delivery and reducing interest
- 18 and other waiting lists for Medicaid programs described under
- 19 Subsection (a) of this section, including recommendations for
- 20 potential legislation; and
- 21 (2) a methodology the commission should implement that
- 22 would prioritize persons on a list who have more urgent needs for
- 23 program services.
- 24 (d) Based on the Health and Human Services Commission's
- 25 findings of the study conducted under this Act, the commission
- 26 shall update its statewide strategic plan on the intellectual and
- 27 developmental disabilities system in this state that was developed

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- 1 in relation to the statewide behavioral health strategic plan
- 2 required under Section 10.04 of the Article IX health-related
- 3 provisions, Chapter 1281 (H.B. 1), Acts of the 84th Legislature,
- 4 Regular Session, 2015 (the General Appropriations Act), including
- 5 updating related short- and long-term goals, objectives, and
- 6 strategies to address identified gaps in services for persons with
- 7 an intellectual or developmental disability, timelines for
- 8 implementation of the plan, and mechanisms for tracking plan
- 9 outcomes.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act expires September 1, 2023.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
